





#### Galena standout earns first-team all-state

Earlier this season, Pearle Green scored the 1,000th point of her Galena girls' basketball career. And she's only a junior.

"She's one of the best three-point shooters in the state," Galena head coach David Wightman said.
But Green is more than just a shooter.

"She's always at the front of our press,"
Wightman said. "She loves to play defense and
offense."

And that all-around game is what draws the attention of Wightman's fellow coaches at the 3A level, and Green has been recognized for her efforts. Green has been named to the first team of the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Girls All-State Team.

"The interesting thing about Pearle is she can pretty much play any position," Wightman said of the 5-foot-7 junior. "If we need points inside, she

doesn't even mind posting kids up. She has good post moves even for a guard."

Wightman said Green has put herself in a position to have success.

"The big thing that stands out is her work ethic," Wightman said. "She's been putting in a ton of time."

Wightman said Green has been able to go to camps and spends a tremendous amount of time in the gym during the offseason.

Green is a three-year starter for Galena and has aspirations to play at the next level, Wightman said. She is also the first Galena girls player to reach 1,000 points since former Galena standout Jenna Buchanan, the 2012 3A girls player of the year, hit the milestone. Buchanan also played college basketball at UAA.

"I think she has dreams to follow in Jenna's footsteps," Wightman said.

Wightman said Green excels on and off the court. Green currently carries a 4.0 grade point average.

"She's just a great kid. Positive attitude, very coachable," Wightman said.

#### Anchorage Christian's top shooter named state's top

It doesn't take long to figure at least one thing out about Orlando Lozano.

The Anchoarge Christian School senior can shoot the basketball.

"If we're just doing a shooting contest, I'm picking him," ACS head coach Zack Madren said.

Madren said he honestly could not think of a better pure shooter than Lozano in the state right now. But there is more to Lozano's game than just shooting, and coaches across the state have recognized that. Lozano has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Boys Player of the Year.

Lozano enters the state tournament leading his team with an average of 17 points per game, according to statistics on asaa365.com. He has nearly 400 total points this season, and the majority have come from beyond the arc. Lozano has hit 91 threes, while shooting about 45 percent from three. Madren said of Lozano's overall growth and maturity as a player includes his shot selection.

"He used to just jack'm," Madren said. "Now he picks and chooses his best time to shoot."

It's obviously no secret that Lozano can shoot the ball, Madren said, and the Lions take that into consideration. "I know a lot of other coaches game plan for that" Madren said. "Many times we've used him as a decoy, and he's happy to do it."

Lozano is also second on his team with 70 assists.

"He's a team-first guy," Madren said. "He could very easily want to dominate the basketball, take the most shots. He's very unselfish, very willing to make that extra pass."

Madren said Lozano brings a confidence to the floor stemming from the time he has put in. "He puts in a lot of work in the offseason, a lot of work in practice and on his own time," Madren said. Lozano has also shown a great deal of maturity as a senior.

#### Dimond star named state's top player for third straight year

Another year, another batch of honors for Dimond star Alissa Pilli.

About two weeks after she was named the Gatorade Alaska Girls' Basketball Player of the Year for the third straight year, Pili has been named the Knight's Taxidermy/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches for the third consecutive season.

"Alissa Pili is a fantastic basketball player," South Anchorage head coach Larry Wilson said in a press release issued by Gatorade. "She's a great scorer, she grabs a lot of rebounds and she's stronger than everybody. What gets overshadowed by all of the points is her passing, which is the best I've seen up here." Pili also passed the former leading scorer in Alaska girls' basketball history in February. Former Chugiak standout Brit Jacobson had held the state's career scoring mark with 2,290 total points. But Pili coasted by that and has spent the final weeks of the season building herself a cushion at the top of the list.

Pili, who helped the defending state champion Lynx earn the No. 1 seed in the 2019 4A state tournament, is averaging 28 points and 16 rebounds as a senior.

This is also the fourth straight year Pili has earned first-team all-state honors.

Pili is also among a handful of Alaska seniors prepared to make the jump to the Division I level next year. Pili has signed her National Letter of Intent to play for Southern California.
