“Be Loud... Be Proud... but Be Positive!”: ASAA acknowledges that fan enthusiasm and support are a great part of high school athletics and activities. Active enthusiasm and cheering is encouraged. ASAA is committed to creating a safe, comfortable, and enjoyable environment for all fans, parents, coaches, volunteers, and participants. Sportsmanship and respect toward opponents, championship officials and staff is expected at all times.

ASAA state events are meant to provide a safe, comfortable, and enjoyable environment for everyone. Tournament managers and ASAA event personnel have the authority to remove individuals for inappropriate behavior or comments as outlined in the ASAA Fan Code of Conduct.

- **Artificial Noise Makers:** Laser pointers, whistles, and air-horns are prohibited. Thunder sticks and other artificial noise makers are banned from indoor events. Additional prohibitions may be enforced by the hosting school district in accordance with established policies, procedures and local laws. NFHS rules may restrict other items.
- **Language/Behavior:** Foul, abusive language, obscene gestures, behavior that is unruly, disruptive, or illegal in nature are not allowed. Cheering or yells degrading opponents or others will not be tolerated.
- **Signs:** Schools are allowed to hang signs that are positive and directed only towards the schools team. Signs will be removed if hung over sponsor signs or other state championship signs.
- **Tobacco/Alcohol/Drugs:** All ASAA events are tobacco, alcohol, and drug free.
- **Photography/Video Taping:** No flash photography. Photography and video taping from the stands and spectator area is allowed. Fans, parents, coaches, school employees, etc. are not allowed to photograph outside the spectator area. Those areas are reserved for working members of the media and ASAA's official photographer.
- **Passes:** Anyone attempting to enter ASAA events with a fraudulent pass will be denied entry and may be removed from the facility and denied entrance.
