2006 FIRST NATIONAL BANK ALASKA STATE HIGH SCHOOL DRAMA-DEBATE-FORENSICE COMPETITION RESULTS

2006 state competition includes four more schools than last year

ANCHORAGE, Alaska – The 2006 ASAA/First National Bank Alaska State High School Drama-Debate and Forensics (DDF) Competition included four more schools that last year's state tournament. The University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) hosted the contest, under the direction of co-tournament directors Steve Johnson and Shawnalee Whitney, professors of communication and speech & debate coaches at UAA. There were 233 student competitors representing 22 high schools at the event.

Participating schools included: Bartlett, Chugiak, Dimond, <u>Eagle River</u>, East Anchorage, Haines, Homer, <u>Igiugig</u>, Juneau-Douglas, Ketchikan, Lower Kuskokwim School District, <u>Lumen Christi</u>, Mt.Edgecumbe, Nikiski, Service, Sitka, <u>Skagway</u>, Skyview, South Anchorage, West Anchorage, Whitestone and Wrangell.
