

#### FEW REMINDERS FROM THE ASAA APRIL BOARD MEETING

Below are some of the highlights from the April meeting. You can find detailed minutes on the ASAA website under Resources/Board of Directors - <u>Un-Adopted Minutes of the Board Meeting</u>.

- Basketball & Hockey Cheerleading: Adopted a 12 participant limit.
- 3A/4A Volleyball State Roster Limit: Volleyball State Roster has been increased from 12 to 14 players.
- Hockey & Basketball Mercy Rule: The Mercy Rule will begin at anytime in the game, it is not limited to 3rd period or the 4th quarter only.
- **Wrestling:** Wrestling match recording procedure is set up by ASAA to help create one unified system for the regular season <u>Wrestling Match Recording Procedure</u>.
- Mix Six: Mix Six volleyball state championship this year will be a double elimination bracket.
- Hockey: INDIVIDUAL NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION ASAA prohibits students, in grades 10-12 who are members of a high school team, from competing as a member of a non-school comp or junior hockey or out of state traveling house team beginning with the first game of that school until a school team has completed its season. The prohibition on competing on a non-school team will be lifted during Thanksgiving and Christmas vacations dates as they are determined by schools and districts, as well as on Sundays and Mondays through the 3rd Monday each January to coincide with Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday. Although this rule does not restrict practice on a non-school team during the high school season, no student may participate in a high school game on a day in which they have participated in a "comp" practice. # EMERGENCY ACTION PLANS (EAP)

Good emergency action plans for school sports and activities are critical. Although rare, life and limb-threatening injuries can occur at any time, and it is the responsibility of the school to ensure everyone involved is prepared to handle the situation. Designing an EAP and educating those involved in after school sports and activities is vital.

One of the most important parts of the education process is practicing the plan. Practice sessions can make good preseason in-service training opportunities for the entire staff and can provide a good opportunity for school personnel to interact with medical providers in the community, including local EMS professionals. The greater the familiarity with those involved in carrying out the EAP, the smoother the response will be in a real emergency situation.

#### **COACHING INFORMATION**

#### **Coaching Certification**

All coaches representing a member school in athletic competition must be certified. To become certified, coaches must complete the Alaska Coaches Education Program.

- 1. Fundamentals of Coaching Course
- 2. Alaska State Component Course
- 3. First Aid Certification
- 4. NFHS Learn Concussion Awareness Course
- 5. NFHS Learn Sudden Cardiac Arrest Course

All the classes above can be completed at NFHSLearn.com. Create your NFHS Learn Online Account to start the process. Select Alaska as your state and follow all the prompts.

#### **VOLUNTEER COACHES & ADVISORS**

The Alaska Coaches Education Program is required for all high school athletic coaches who have direct supervision of students. This may include head coaches and assistant coaches at all levels, as well as non paid coaches and coaches of out-sourced programs.

A volunteer is an individual that works with a school's athletic team in the same manner as a coach but is never in direct supervision of students and is not compensated. Beginning with the 2019-20 school year volunteers will be required to complete the NFHS Concussion Awareness and Sudden Cardiac Arrest Courses.

An advisor is an individual that works in a school's activity program and has direct supervision of students. Beginning with the 2019-20 school year Music Directors will be required to complete the NFHS Concussion Awareness and Sudden Cardiac Arrest Courses.
