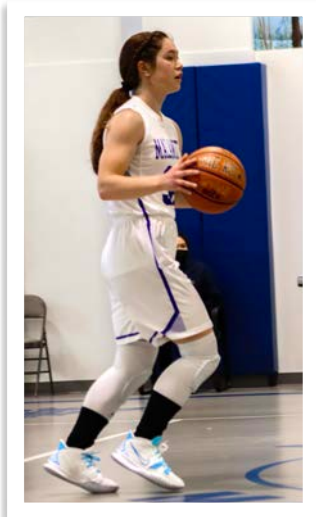

Newhalen's multisport standout earns a basketball top honor

Within the last 18 months, Aileen Lester won the Division III girls title at the 2020 state cross-country running championships and was the runner-up at 130 pounds during the 2019 girls state wrestling championships.

A gold and a silver during her first two years of high school.

But the Newhalen sophomore is also pretty good at basketball.

Lester has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Girls Player of the Year.

"She's an all-around athlete," Newhalen head coach James Barthelman said. "To be totally honest, she's a wrestler first, and a basketball player second, and a

cross-country runner third." But that does not mean Lester takes anything about basketball less seriously, Barthelman said.

"Aileen cares more about the team winning than any award bestowed on her," Barthelman said. "Earlier this year she was ranked nationally in her weight class for wrestling. She has sacrificed multiple opportunities to play basketball with her teammates. She waits until after the ball season to follow that true passion."

Barthelman said Lester has the work ethic that leads to her success in all three sports.

"She works out religiously," the head coach said. "We have morning workouts she leads. She runs all summer long. She's constantly thinking about how she can get better physically."

In basketball, Lester does not have to be her team's leading scorer to make an impact.

"On the basketball court it's all grit and hustle and defense that she's all about," Barthelman said. "Since her eighth grade year we put her on the other team's best player. It doesn't matter if it's the point guard or if it's the post player, that's Aileen's job."

Barthelman said Lester does the things that don't show up on the scoresheet.

"She's an excellent rebounder. She does all of the little things," Barthelman said.

Even though she is still an underclassman, Lester is the captain and leader of the team.

"Last year she really took over that role," Barthelman said.

Lester is also a standout in the classroom.

"She's taking a full load of online college classes," Barthelman said. "She's already met the graduation requirements for our school district. She'll have an associate's degree by the time she graduates high school. She cares as much about academics as anything she does athletically. That's always really impressive."

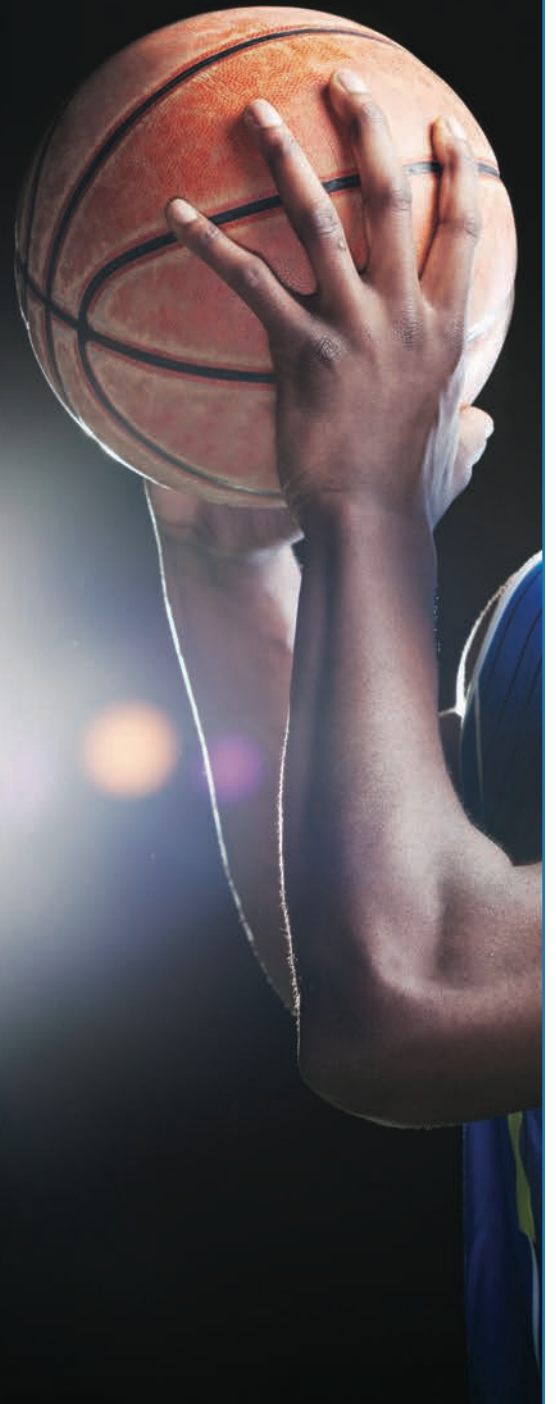

Newcomer to Ninilchik makes immediate impact

It didn't take long for Landon Colburn to make an impact. The junior point guard arrived in Ninilchik a week into the prep basketball season. Now the newcomer is recognized as one of Alaska's best. Colburn has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 1A Boys Player of the Year.

"He's embraced Ninilchik and Ninilchik has embraced him," Ninilchik head coach Dick Hawkins said. "It's been a good fit."

Hawkins said it was a very smooth transition as Ninilchik welcomed the point guard to the program after Colburn moved from Oregon.

"It didn't seem like a problem," Hawkins said. "We got him into the practices. We told the kids, they knew he was coming. They accepted him, embraced him. His personality, he doesn't try and show off. He doesn't have to. He just does what he does."

With the easy transition, Ninilchik was able to add to their potential for success.

"We already had a good team before he got here and he fit right in," Hawkins said. "As a coach you couldn't ask for anything better. He's coachable. We showed him what we had as far as plays and stuff like that, and he fit right in."

And Colburn did a lot in his first season in the 49th state. He averaged nearly 25 points per game, which included a season high of 33 points.

"He brings a lot of energy to whatever he does," Hawkins said. "He's a real energetic kid.

He's not real tall, but he plays big. But that is in part to the energy he brings. He's fast. He's quick."

Hawkins said has a broad skill set.

"He dribbles the ball really well, he passes really well. He has an excellent shot," Hawkins said. "He's got a full bag of tricks, and he's not afraid of anybody."

Hawkins said Colburn also quickly fit in off the court.

"He's just a nice kid. Kids like to be around him. He's looking forward to the summer. Kids have already said they are going to take him fishing and do the Alaska thing with him," Hawkins said.

Second-generation Viking named 2A's top player

Brennan Skeek has been a big part of the Petersburg boys basketball program for the past four years. Surrounded by all-state caliber talent the point guard has helped the Vikings continue to stay among the top tier of 2A programs in the state. This year, Skeek has earned one of the state's top honors. Skeek has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 2A Boys Player of the Year. "I'm so happy and proud he was recognized with this honor," Petersburg head coach Richard Brock said. "He's been on really good teams with really good players. We've always known how important he is to us. He's played with multiple all-state players. It's great that this year, even with all of the starts and stops and the different year, that he's being recognized. I'm very happy for him and his family that he's being recognized."

Skeek found his way into the starting lineup during his freshman season, and has been a key piece to the Petersburg puzzle ever since.

"I can't remember when I've had a freshman (junior varsity) player who people would watch in the JV. games who would get the oohs and ahhs from the crowd just because of the plays he could make in the open court, and with his athleticism."

Brock said Skeek, as a freshman, quickly filled the void left by an all-state senior who led Petersburg to a state title the year before.

"He took over the point guard position as a freshman and actually played really well in the state tournament as a freshman," Brock said. "From a young age, we knew we had a really good player there."

Brock, the longtime head coach of the Petersburg program, said he can't recall ever having a four-year starter at point guard prior to Skeek. "I've had some really good players. I've had freshmen that played a lot of varsity. (Point guard) is a hard position to play as a freshman," Brock said. Brock said Skeek is a pass-first point guard.

"He's always been the guy with this group that has done whatever that needs to be done on the floor for us to be successful. He's a very selfless person and player," Brock said.

Brock said Skeek took on another role as a senior.

"We needed him to score this year," Brock said. Skeek led the Vikings in scoring, assists and steals as a senior. Brock said Skeek has a calm demeanor on and off the floor. "He's a real quiet person, so he leads by example," Brock said. "He's really calm and consistent. He's been that way since he was a freshman on the court."

Brock said Skeek has used those traits to help the Vikings through the season. "In a chaotic year like this, having that calm and consistency every day in practice has been huge. To show up every day with the uncertainty, putting in a hard day's work every day in practice is huge for those guys to look at," Brock said.

Skeek is also a second-generation Viking. Brock also coached Skeek's dad and uncle. Skeek's mother was also an athlete at Petersburg High. "Great thing about being from a small town like this, I've known him for a very long time," Brock said of Skeek.

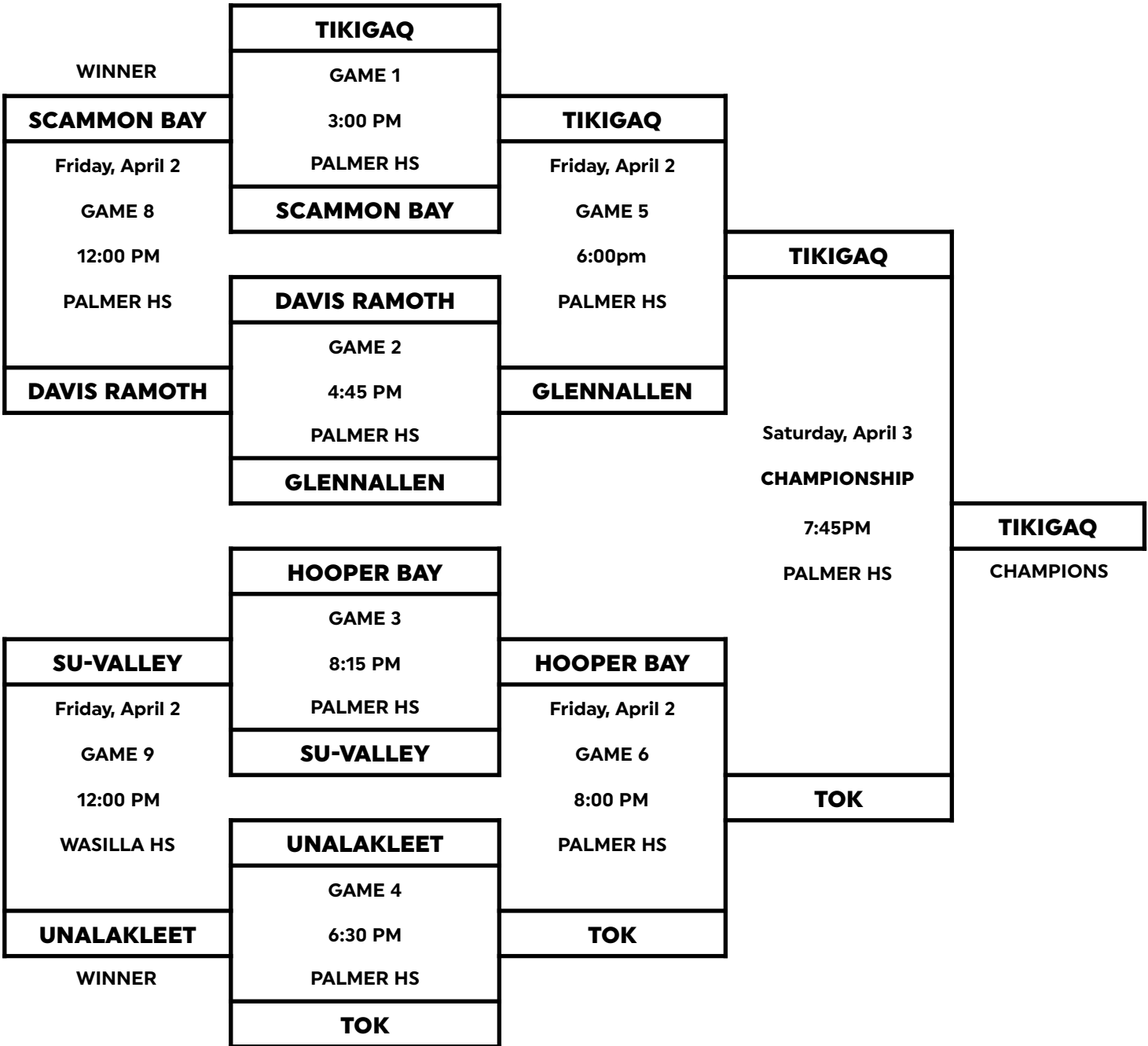

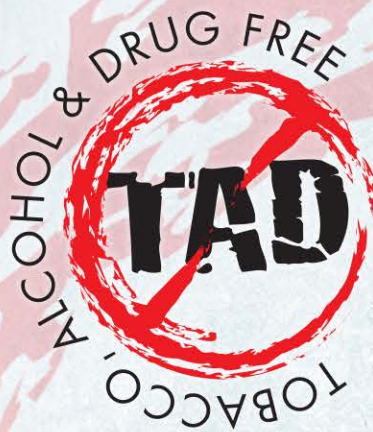
