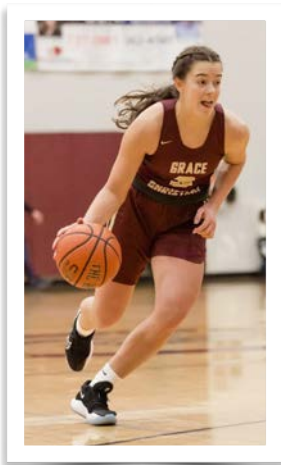

## After leading her team through adversity, Grace senior named the 3A girls top player

Much like most programs throughout the 49th state, the Grace Christian girls basketball team was thrown more than its fair share of obstacles as Alaska schools worked through a high school basketball season during the pandemic.

Low turnout early in the season. Serious injury. COVID-19 protocol. The Grizzlies were even in a vehicle accident during their road trip to Fairbanks. "This year has been a crazy year for our team," Grace head coach Pete Johnson said.

But the Grizzlies overcame those obstacles, and Johnson said senior standout Tessa Binder is the big reason why.

"If Tessa hadn't of been on this team, it would not have been as successful of a season, She's the glue that stuck everybody together," Johnson said.

Binder was a leader and an inspiration, Johnson said. She was also a great player, and coaches across the state agree. Binder

has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Girls Player of the Year. Binder averaged 23 points, seven rebounds, four assists and five steals per game as a senior. But it's more than just individual success, Johnson said. Binder makes everyone around her better.

"We could stick her with four eighth-graders and she would still score 23 points a game and still encourage them," Johnson said. "That's the big thing about Tessa. She is such an encourager. She makes people around her better because of the way she encourages, uplifts, I think that's what stands out about Tessa, more than her athletic prowess. Her love for her teammates blows my mind."

Johnson said Binder was the leader as the Grizzlies worked through all of the ups and downs. "When we started off we didn't have very many girls. Everybody's thinking we're probably not going to be able to play because of the COVID restrictions and all of that stuff," Johnson said. Johnson said as some people fixated on masks and pandemic protocol, Binder just wanted to play.

"Tessa came out and said even if we only have two games, I'm in. Even if we only have one game I'm in," Johnson said. When Grace lost a key player to a serious injury in Valdez, Binder encouraged two others to play. One worked her way into the starting lineup. During the Fairbanks road trip, the team van was in an accident after hitting black ice. Nobody was hurt, Johnson said. Binder helped her teammates out of the van and find their belongings.

Johnson said Binder, a skilled and athletic point guard, is also a coach on the floor.

"She doesn't even need a coach on the bench," Johnson said. "She could coach on the floor as she's playing and her team would be successful. Her basketball I.Q. is up there."

And there is also a deep love for the game.

"She loves basketball. She eats, sleeps, dreams basketball," Johnson said. Johnson said Binder has drawn interest from programs at the next level and is excited about her college basketball future. "She's got fabulous potential," Johnson said. "Wherever she goes she's going to be an impact player." And that's on and off the court, Johnson said. "You want someone in the locker room who's keeping everyone's head on straight and who people respect," Johnson said. "People respect Tessa because of the way that she plays and she uses that as a platform. She has that influence because she has that gift to play basketball that God's given her."

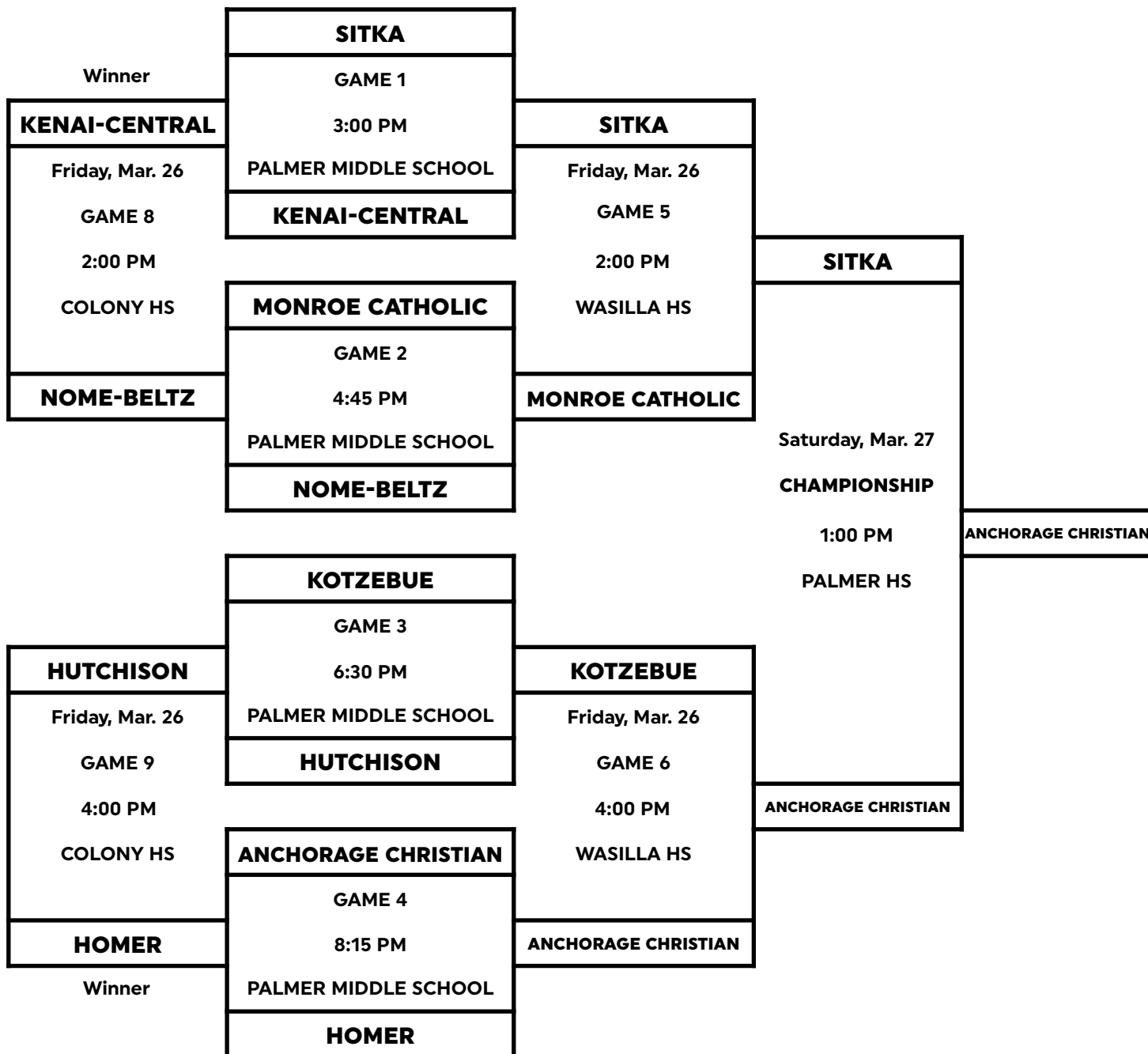

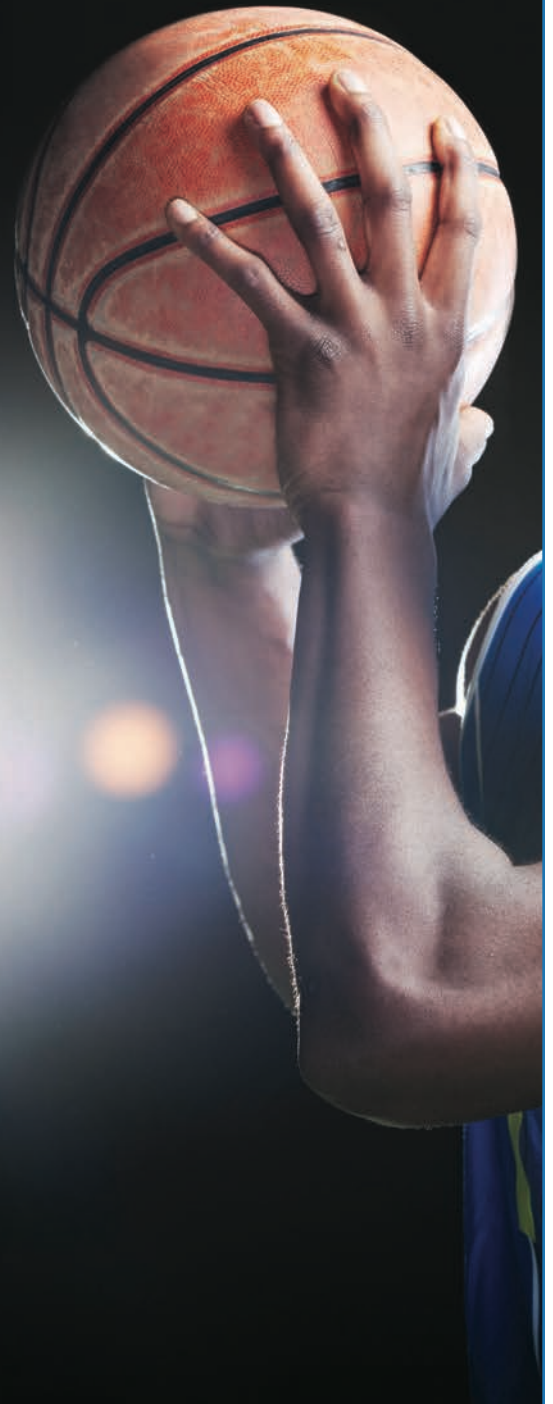

## Monroe senior earns top honor

Quinn McHenry has continued to evolve during his four years with the Monroe Catholic varsity program. He found a role as a shooter during his freshman season, and joined the starting lineup as a sophomore. Now the Monroe senior and three-year starter is among Alaska's elite. McHenry has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Boys Player of the Year.

"He continues to improve and progress," Monroe head coach Frank Ostanik said. McHenry's shooting has always stood out. "The first thing I think that people recognize is that he's 6-5 and he can shoot the ball well, and he has decent range," Ostanik said. "Having somebody with size that can shoot the ball makes him a little bit unique. I think that was the first thing that was noticeable about Quinn."

Ostanik said McHenry's defined role as a freshman involved shooting the basketball.

"He did those things as a freshman. He was surrounded by really good players who could kick it to him and all he had to do was hit the shot," Ostanik said. But throughout his four years, McHenry's game continued to evolve. "This year his game has expanded. He can score in more ways," Ostanik said. "He scores a little bit more now in the post, a little bit more now on the glass." But the improvement goes beyond just scoring. "He's always been a decent rebounder. I think he's a better rebounder. He's bigger and stronger. He rebounds in traffic at a higher level. He's able to take care of the ball," Ostanik said. "He's able to possess the ball in traffic at a level he wasn't able to do in the past. He's improved in all of those areas." In November of 2020, McHenry signed his National Letter of Intent to play college basketball at Division II Sonoma State of the California Collegiate Athletic Association. "I think that's a good level and that's a good league," Ostanik said. "I think it makes a lot of sense. They seemed to want him. It's always good to be someplace where they covet you. I think that's important for a kid." Ostanik said McHenry's new home at the California school will also be close to where his family plans to relocate. "I think there are so many benefits to where he is going," Ostanik said. Ostanik said McHenry's family has been an important part of the senior's continued success.

"His parents have been extraordinarily from the standpoint they have high expectations for their son and have no problem with their son being coached and challenged," Ostanik said. "I think he's been fortunate. Not every child has parents that hold them accountable and understand what it takes to play at the next level. And he certainly does. I think that's been a key ingredient in having success. Obviously he's played an important role in that as well. But the parents have been critical."

Overall, Ostanik said McHenry is a valuable person to a school on and off the court. "Quinn is an exceptional student. He's a kid who is never going to cause anybody grief. Whoever coaches Quinn is going to be able to focus on simply coaching basketball. They're not going to have to worry about him being a knucklehead someplace or doing the wrong thing," Ostanik said. "He'll always represent your organization at the highest level. You won't have to worry about him being eligible. Those guys are a pleasure to coach and Quinn will very much be that for the guy he plays for."

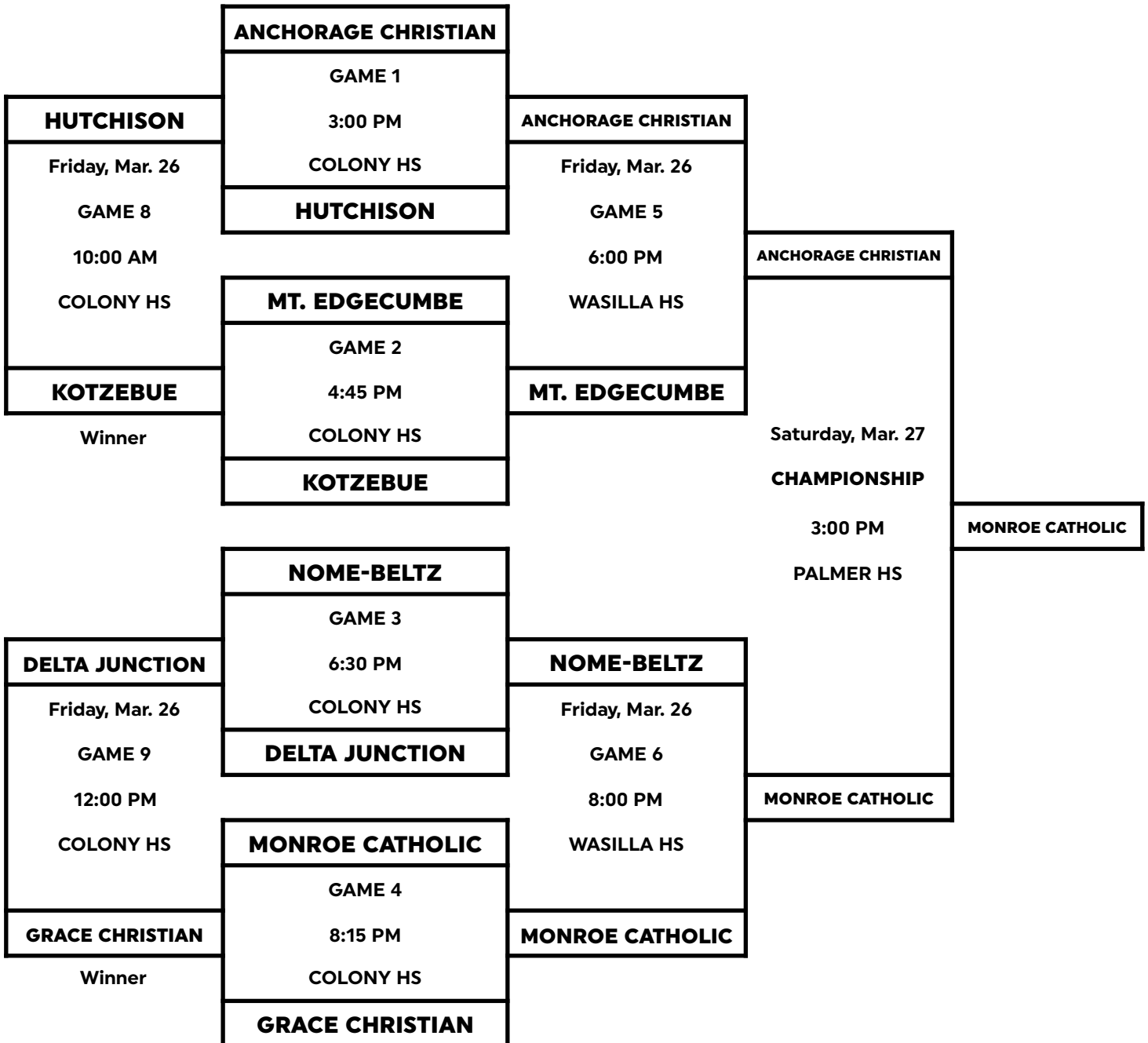

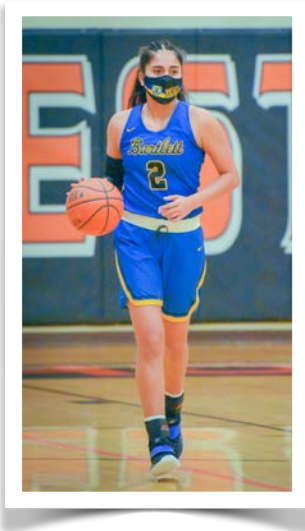

## Bartlett standout named the 4A girls top player

It didn't take long for Bartlett High School girls basketball head coach Clarence Smith to see Amelia Uhila's potential.

"In her freshman year, I'll never forget it. It was at a (Cook Inlet Conference) tournament game in the quarterfinals at West. I told one of my assistant coaches, if she's not (Division I), I don't know what is," Smith said. Smith was right. The Bartlett senior standout will play women's college basketball for Division I Portland State University next year. Uhila has also been recognized as the best in the state. Uhila has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Assoc. of Basketball Coaches 4A Girls Player of the Year.

"I tell anyone, Bartlett High School basketball's success is a direct reflection of Amelia Uhila coming to Bartlett in 2017," Smith said. "I don't think we would have been as successful if she would have never come." On March 20, Uhila helped lead the Bartlett girls to their first CIC title in 29 years.

The four-year starter has amassed historic totals during her Golden Bears career. Entering the CIC tourney, Uhila had

1,540 points, 492 rebounds, 486 assists and 392 steals. Smith said Uhila led the Golden Bears in scoring, assists and steals in each of her four years. Uhila also led Bartlett in rebounding in two of those four years, and was second the other two years. Smith said Uhila has always been talented. The big thing that's changed, is Uhila is now the leader. Smith said when she was an underclassman, Bartlett had seniors to be the voice of the team. Uhila didn't have to be the leader. Now she's stepped up into that role.

"We have eight freshman. They look up to her. She's busting her butt in practice and they try to match that intensity," Smith said. Smith said he likes Portland State as the future home for Uhila. "I think it's a great fit. It's not too far from her family. She's very family oriented. It's not too far to go watch her play," Smith said.

Smith said Uhila has both the skill set and the intangibles to be able to compete for a role on the team right away, and has great potential at the Division I level.

"The sky's the limit for her," Smith said. Overall, Smith said Uhila is a good student and person, "She's probably the most humble person you'll ever meet," Smith said. "To see her in the hallways at Bartlett, to see her in public you wouldn't know she's a star basketball player. She's a very mild-mannered kid," Smith said. "She's a well-rounded person."

## Colony standout earns player of the year honors for the second straight season

During his prep career, Colony High School standout Patrick McMahon has become known partly for his high-flying highlight reel worthy dunks. Colony head coach Tom Berg said the key to McMahon's overall success has been the big leaps he makes from season to season.

"If you want to be really, really good, I'd say every summer you've got to take a big jump," Berg said of his advice to McMahon.

And that's what he did.

Now McMahon is on the top of Alaska's basketball ladder once again. McMahon has been named the Wasilla Lithia Dodge/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 4A Player of the Year for the second straight season.

Berg said McMahon had the physicality to play 25 minutes of varsity basketball every night as a freshman. As McMahon progressed through the program, goals were set. During

McMahon's sophomore year, the goal was to score more on offense and decide to be a part of the game plan on defense. Everything started to come together during McMahon's junior season.

"Last year was just nuts. He really did engage on both ends of the floor. He figured out he could truly just dominate a game on both sides of the floor," Berg said. Now McMahon, a senior, is viewed as Alaska's top talent by most. McMahon is averaging 27 points, 11 rebounds, two blocks and two assists per game this season. He is also shooting 57 percent from the field and 39 percent from beyond the arc. McMahon, a 6-foot-6 standout, is projected as a guard at the Division I level.

"A 6-6 win, that's a Division I wing," Berg said. McMahon has stood out all over the floor for the Knights. Part of that goes back to taking the big leaps, Berg said. "A big jump for Patty last year, (we asked) can you guard a wing?" Berg said. McMahon answered the question.

"When I talk about his dominance his junior year, his jump last year was on the defensive end," Berg said. "He was good offensively as a sophomore. He had the offensive side of things figured out."

In November of 2020, McMahon signed his National Letter of Intent to play for Division I Montana State. Berg said McMahon has a very high ceiling.

"He could really end up being a dominant player in that league," Berg said of McMahon in the Big Sky Conference.

Part of that is the fact that McMahon possesses both physical tools and the intangibles, Berg said.

"He has all of the genetic parts. He has the right temperament," Berg said. Berg said sometimes the best players are the most high strung. But not McMahon, he said.

"He's one of the most even keel superstars I've ever coached. He goes about his business. I've never had to talk to him about playing hard," Berg said. Berg also said he sees potential for a shot at the level beyond college. "I've coached a lot of good players, and no disrespect. But (McMahon) is the first I'd say could play pro somewhere," Berg said.

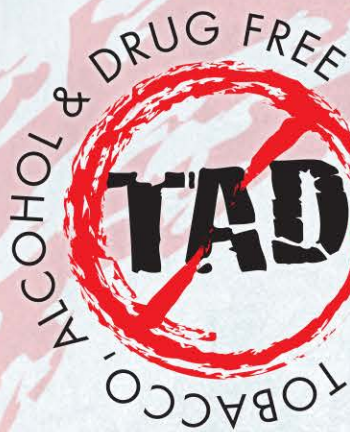
