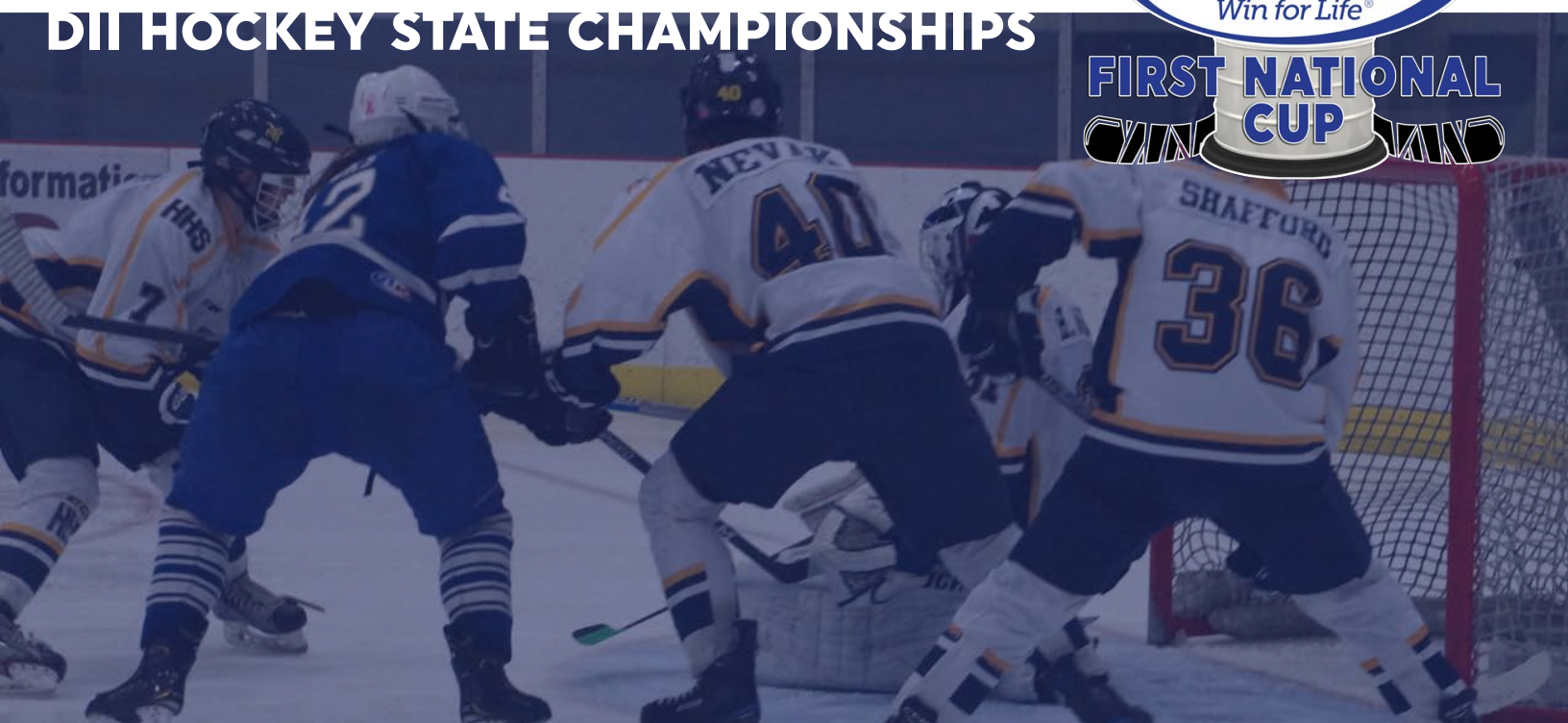

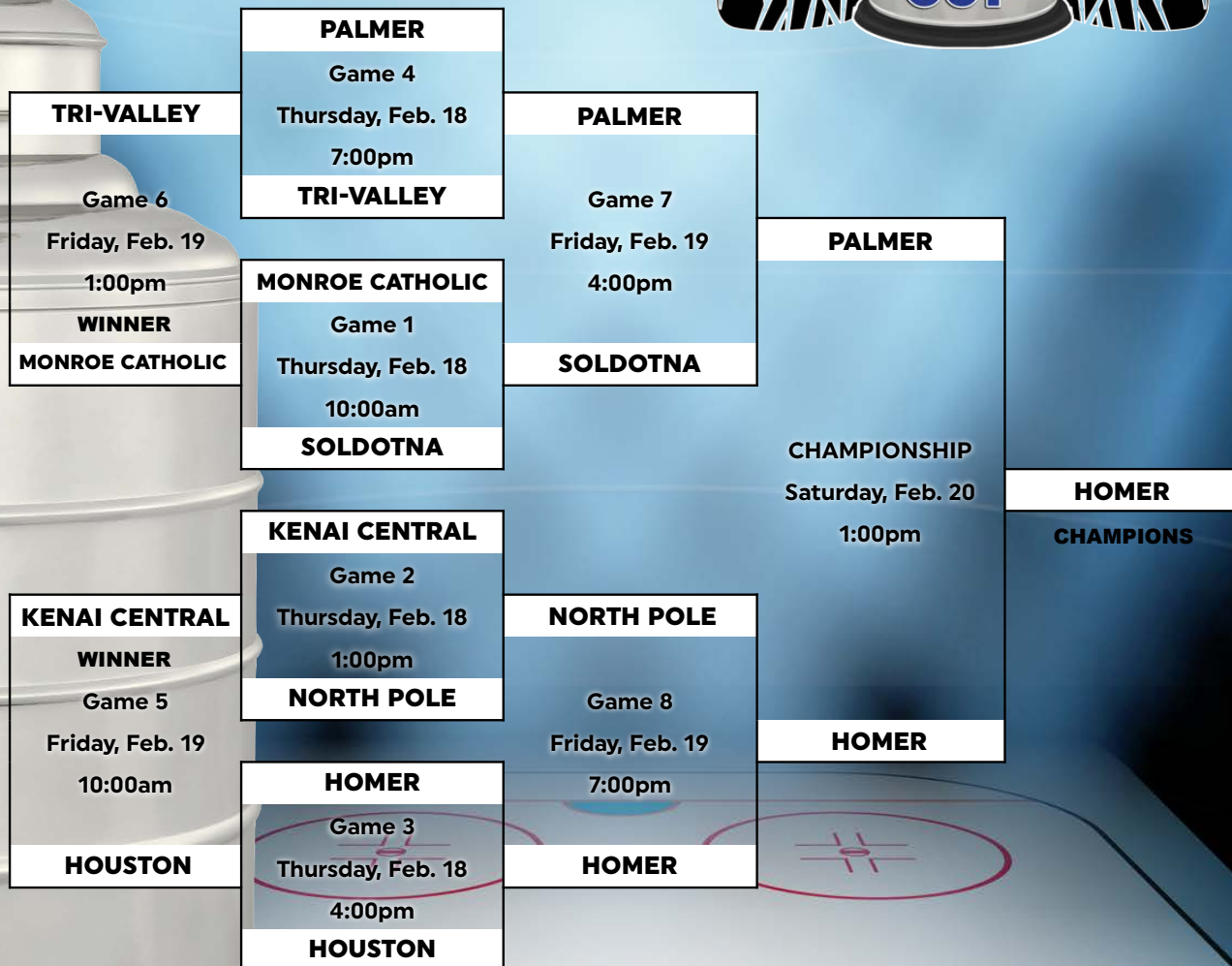

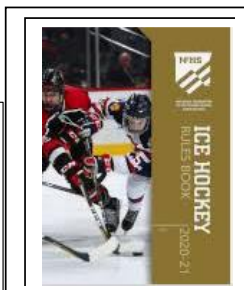
Referee Fun Facts

Did you know...

- AHO has 161 officials completing registration for the 2020-21 season
- Level 4 referees are USA Hockey's most skilled officials & must score 90% annually on a written exam and pass a skating test each fall.
- Alaska has 18 Level 4 officials this year.
- Alaska has 49 Level 3 officials this year.
- Alaska High School hockey is governed by NFHS and not USA Hockey. Referees for high school hockey must pass a separate exam and apply different rules.



Louis Imbriani grew up in Anchorage playing competitive hockey & starting his refing career at age 13. Imbriani played juniors in Great Falls, MT & Wichita, KS. He is a mentoring referee who routinely works Pacific District Regional tournaments & USA Hockey National Championships each April. He also refs all levels of youth & adult hockey in the Anchorage area.



Hugh Towe is based in the Valley and is a fixture at youth and adult games in the Valley, Eagle River and Anchorage rinks. Towe, who has refereed for 10 years, routinely referees house, comp, high school JV and varsity games across the state. He also helps conduct USA Hockey referee clinics each fall for new and returning officials.



Josh Ellis is arguably Alaska's most decorated referee. Ellis was a career official and has worked at the highest levels of hockey, advancing to the American Hockey League (AHL), just one step below the NHL. A professional hunting guide, Ellis routinely works many of Alaska's biggest games for both ASAA high school and ASHA comp.



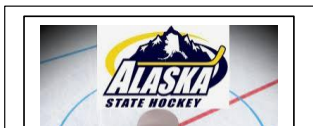
Scott Sivilich is president of AHO (Alaska Hockey Officials) and one of Alaska's most decorated. Sivilich was a full time official in the Western Hockey League & a linesman in the ECHL & WCHA. He has refereed USA Hockey National Championship games, ASHA state championships and high school tournaments for 20+ years.



Gunnar Hanson is one of Alaska's top up-and-coming officials. The Eagle River native won a 2020 state high school championship as a player at West and heads to Stanford University in Palo Alto, CA this fall to pursue a degree in engineering. Hanson works youth, adult and high school games across South-central AK as both a referee and a linesman.



Steve Woods is a board member of AHO who played college hockey at UMass-Lowell, racking up 166 points over his 4-year career. He was inducted into the UMass-Lowell Hall of Fame in 1992. Woods resides in Palmer and routinely works high school, youth and adult games across the state. He and his wife are also award winning British Lab dog breeders.

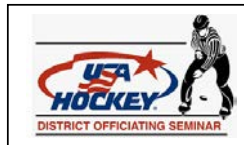

Rothermel also donates his time as an official to the annual Army vs. Air Force games in Fairbanks & Anchorage.



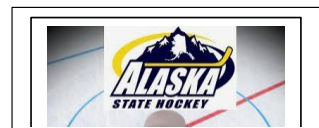
Gabe O'Lena was most recently selected to work the 18AAA division of the Pacific District Regional Championships in March. The former goaltender and Kenai native has worked games for the Alaska Aces in the ECHL, UAA & NAHL games in Kenai & Fairbanks. He is a current member of the AHO Board and mentors' new officials.



Kyle Embley has been a fixture in the refereeing fraternity at the highest levels of Alaska hockey. The Anchorage native and Dimond High alum routinely works high school & advanced level comp games in Anchorage & Southcentral Alaska. Embley also works Pacific District Tournaments & USA Hockey Nationals.



Carl E Brent is beginning his sixth decade of officiating in Alaska after refing his first hockey game in Alaska in 1978, and High School Hockey since 1979. This lifelong Green Bay Packer's fan is one of the founders of AHO and was a regular official at UAA and UAF games. He continues to ref youth, HS & adult games, mostly in the Valley & Big Lake

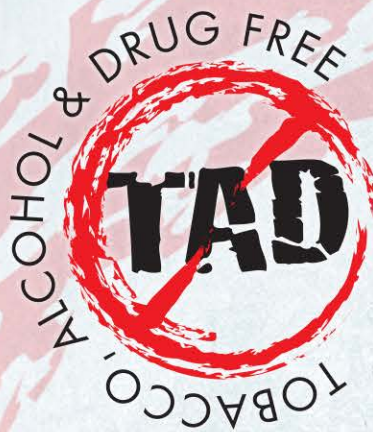
