Cheer Rules and Guidelines: All cheer coaches/teams are required to follow the 2019-20 NFHS Spirit Rulebook.

Coaches Meeting: Cheer coaches must be at their classifications coaches meeting. The times are below.

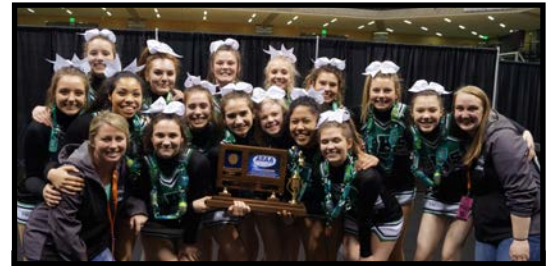
- 1A - March 17th at 5:45pm in Aux Gym
- 2A - March 18th 5:45pm in Dresser Conference Room 2nd Floor
- 3A/4A - March 24 - 1pm - 6pm pick up packets at main arena

Rosters: ASAA is using Planet HS for its School Activities Reporting System (SARS). Schools will need to submit rosters and indicate which students have qualified for state through this system. This can be done by accessing the cheer eligibility roster. Submissions are due by 2pm on the following:

- *Sunday, March 15 - All 1A, 2A, 3A Conferences & 4A Southeast and Mid Alaska Conferences*
- *Sunday, March 22 - 4A Cook Inlet and Northern Lights Conferences*

Coaches must verify official rosters when the head coach picks up their packet on (1A) Tuesday, March 17th (2) Wednesday, March 18th and (3) Tuesday, March 24. A copy of your submitted roster via the PLANET HS ROSTER will be included in the coaches' packet. All Head Coaches must their confirmed roster or corrected roster at that time. Following your review on pick up, no changes to roster personnel may be made.

Violations of Rules/Roster: If any rules or roster submissions are violated the team will not be allowed to cheer as a squad in uniform for the remainder of that game and the rest of the tournament. From that time forward they will be spectators and charged regular admission price.

Practices: ASAA is not providing practice times for cheer teams.

Forms: The following forms need to be completed on the Cheer forms page at asaa.org. Due Sunday, March 15 OR Sunday, March 22 by 2:00 PM.

- State Championship Cheer Entry Form - Select the Activity Box choose Cheer (Sideline)
- State Championship Photo Upload

Sideline Cheer Area: The sideline cheer area is located on the baseline on the far side from the teams bench. The baseline area is clearly marked. Cheer coaches will sit in the bleacher or have chairs provided near their cheer squad. You are allowed only 12 cheerleaders on the sideline at a time. If your squad has more than the allotted number there is an area on the floor they will be able to sit. Only cheerleaders, while in uniform for their teams game, will be permitted in this area.

Passes: Each participating school will be issued passes for state championships, based on the following guidelines.

- **Coaches:** Only certified coaches listed on the School Activities Reporting System (SARS) will receive a pass. Coaches must have on their person the pass while on the main floor. If not the school will be fined \$25.
- **Participants:** Passes will be based on submitted rosters. Managers should be included on the roster. Participants must show their pass to enter the facility. All participants must be in uniform or have their pass with them while on the main floor. If not the school will be fined \$10.
- **All passes are non-transferable and will be confiscated if used fraudulently.**
- **Security and ASAA staff members will be checking each player and coach for their pass. You will not be allowed access into the facility without a pass.**
- **If you lose a pass you will have to purchase regular tickets or your school may be billed.**

1A/2A Home & Visiting Team: The Home Team is the TOP OF THE BRACKET and wears WHITE. When facing the court at the scorers table the HOME TEAM sits on the RIGHT SIDE. The Visiting Team is the BOTTOM OF THE BRACKET and wears DARK COLOR. When facing the court at the scorers table the VISITING TEAM sits on the LEFT SIDE.

3A/4A Home & Visiting Team: The Home Team is the HIGHEST SEEDED TEAM and wears WHITE. When facing the court at the scorers table the HOME TEAM sits on the RIGHT SIDE. The Visiting Team is the LOWER SEEDED TEAM and wears DARK COLOR. When facing the court at the scorers table the VISITING TEAM sits on the LEFT SIDE.

Alaska Airlines Center Facility Access: Teams will be able to enter the Alaska Airlines Center beginning an hour before game time.

Competition Floor Access: To access the competition floor please use the stairs on the right side of the building as soon as you walk into the main entrance. Security WILL be checking passes - MAKE SURE COACHES/PLAYERS have their pass. If you have trouble finding the stairs please ask one of the Alaska Airlines Center staff members.

Full Timeouts: Cheer squads are encouraged to cheer for their team alternating between the two cheer squads during full timeouts. Be sure to visually check with the announcer in case of a special presentation or sponsor acknowledgement.





Sportsmanship: Cheer coaches and athletes must maintain high standards of sportsmanship and demonstrate positive crowd leading skills at all times. Negative sportsmanship will be dealt with based on ASAA Code of Conduct.

Halftimes: Cheer squads are encouraged to do a halftime performance at their teams game.

- Performances are NO MORE THAN 2:30 MINUTES ON & OFF for each squad.
- Music for any routine must be on a smart phone with headphone jack.
- ASAA Staff will notify you if there is a special activity during a half-time of your game.

School Signs: Schools are allowed to hang signs that are positive and directed only towards the schools team. Signs are NOT ALLOWED TO BE HUNG WITH TAPE OR GLUE. BLUE PAINTERS TAPE IS WHAT YOU ARE ALLOWED TO USE. Please ask the Alaska Airlines Center staff for painters tape (blue) to hang signs if you don't have any. School signs will be removed if hung over sponsor, exit, or other ASAA state championship signs. **TEAMS must remove your signage after each game.**

Warm Up Music: All music played for warm-ups and during the game is provided by ASAA and the Alaska Airlines Center.

Towels and Water: Each team is responsible to provide bench towels. Additional towels for wiping floors, etc. will be provided. Gatorade/water and cups will be provided at each bench.

Hospitality: One \$50 gift card for each team has been provided by ASAA to use at the concession stands. Any of the food or drink services on the main floor. There is not a hospitality room at the Alaska Airlines Center for coaches and school admin.

Event Supervision: Each participating school will be requested to identify an administrator or other person approved in advance by the principal who is responsible for the conduct of its coaches, participants and fans throughout the contest, as defined in the ASAA bylaws Article 6, Section 4. Please have the designee check in with ASAA staff upon arrival at the event.

ASAA Statewide Passes: During this event ASAA Statewide Passes are still good to get the pass holder only into the state championships. This pass does not allow floor level access.

Locker Rooms: Teams will not have access to a locker room during ASAA March Madness Alaska. Please come prepared for your game on arrival to the Alaska Airlines Center.

Medical: Orthopedic Physicians of Anchorage (OPA) is the official ASAA State Championships Medical provider. They will be onsite during the entire championship tournament to help provide medical help for injuries. Each team must provide all their own materials and supplies - including tape - if athletes are going to be taped.

Team Parking: ASAA is providing FREE parking at the Alaska Airlines Center. The ASAA March Madness Alaska Parking Map will help you find the best, and most available parking during the event. There is a limited amount of spots available for Team Parking in the EAST LOT in the Main Lot. They will be a lot attendant monitoring the vehicles entrance. Be sure to be a little early to your games especially in the evening because of parking spaces. If you are unable to park in one of those spots in the main lot, please use the drop-off section so teams don't have to walk a long ways.





Reserved Lot (Purple Color):

DO NOT PARK IN THERE! If you do you will incur a \$350 fine from UAA.

Team Parking (Yellow Color):

This area is for teams playing, officials, and some staff. There is a limited amount of spaces. It is first come first serve.

Providence Parking Garages (Blue Color):

Do not park in there until AFTER 5:00pm! Providence is letting us use that space after hours to help with parking. Please do not abuse it.

UAA & Providence Hospital

Campus: The UAA Campus and Providence Hospital are SMOKE FREE. The only place you are allowed to smoke is in your car. Thank you for your cooperation.

Championship Results: All results will be posted on ASAA365.com, through the ASAA365 Mobile App, @ASAAORG (Twitter) and Facebook. All individual and team stats along with all results will be updated during games and when final, this is viewable through the app.

Yearbook Photos: These individuals must remain in the spectator areas. Special and limited arrangements can be made for a school yearbook staff student if you contact Isaiah Vreeman (isaiah@asaa.org) on the Monday prior to the event, if not, access will not be allowed. School Yearbook staff includes the yearbook teacher and a student enrolled in yearbook class. Yearbook teachers must have a yearbook student with them at all times. Only ASAA Credentialed Media are allowed to be outside the spectator area and designated media locations unless otherwise approved by Isaiah Vreeman.

Public Picture/Video: Individuals are encouraged to take pictures and video clips of the games and entertainment that will be happening throughout the event. People who are not ASAA Credentialed Media/Temp Media must stay in spectator areas. Spectators are not allowed onto the floor to picture/video of the games. Event security and ASAA staff will remove individuals who are in areas spectators not allowed. LIVE STREAMING DURING ASAA MARCH MADNESS ALASKA IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED!! ASAA has the granted broadcast rights to this whole event. Any rebroadcast or republication of this event and event programming LIKE FACEBOOK LIVE without the express written consent of A-S-Double A is strictly prohibited. Alaska Airlines Center security or other tournament staff see live streaming of games you will be asked to shut it down. ASAA will be monitoring social media platforms for violations.

Broadcast Media: The NFHS Network will be webcasting ALL games live on the nfhsnetwork.com. Also, various radio stations will be broadcasting based on media requests.





Pep Bands: School Pep Bands wanting to attend must email Isaiah Vreeman (isaiah@asaa.org) by 5pm Monday the week of the tournament. Arrangements for entering the facility will be discussed at that time. This is a neutral site game so School Pep Bands may attend state championship events when conditions allow.

Pep Bands must adhere to the following:

1. Contact ASAA Associate Director Isaiah Vreeman (isaiah@asaa.org) by 5pm the Monday prior to the event.
2. School Administrators shall confirm the "Pep Band" typically performs during regular season games of the team they are coming to support.
3. The student's performing in the "pep band" shall:
 1. Meet all ASAA eligibility requirements
 2. Listed on the school's pep band roster in the School Activities Reporting System

On the day of the event, the band director must meet with the ASAA Announcer & Floor Manager prior to each game for the times they will be allowed to play.

1. May play before the game begins as times allows (possibly 5 minutes)
2. May play at halftime before or after any performances and/or promotions as times allows (possibly 5 minutes).
3. May play between periods and during time-outs as long as it does not interfere with coach's ability to communicate with players or any sponsorship promotions.
4. May play at the end of the contest as times allows (possibly 1-2 minutes).
5. May not play during live action.
6. Musical instruments may not be used as noise makers during the contests.
7. Participation fees will be charged.

Reminder that even with only one pep band at a game, they will not be allowed to play a whole warm up period or halftime. If a pep band doesn't follow the ASAA announcer/ASAA Floor Manager instructions and times for playing, they will be warned first, if it happens again they will not be allowed to play for the rest of the tournament. Drums and electric guitars are allowed if they are not large set ups and don't require lots of power.

Spectator Support Items | Artificial Noise Makers: ASAA prohibits laser pointers, whistles, and any explosive devices or explosive sounds at ALL state championship events. Once play starts on EITHER COURT noise makers are not allowed.

Parents/Fans/Spectators: Parents, fans, and spectators are ENCOURAGED to review the ASAA March Madness Alaska Fan Information document on ASAA.org and ASAA365.com. This will include ticket prices, parking information, directions, etc.

Spectator Etiquette: All spectators are restricted to the spectators areas. ASAA staff and officials are empowered to remove anyone displaying unacceptable conduct from the area and may temporarily suspend the championships, if necessary.

Lost and Found: Alaska Airlines Center has a "Lost & Found". Items that are turned in by ASAA and other will be held for 2 weeks after the event. After that 2 weeks items that can will be donated, others will be thrown away.

ASAA March Madness Alaska Merchandise: During ASAA March Madness Alaska there will be lots of great purchase items to commemorate your experience. Apparel by Northwest Designs, stickers, lanyards, wristbands, and more. Northwest Designs is the Official State Merchandise Vendor. 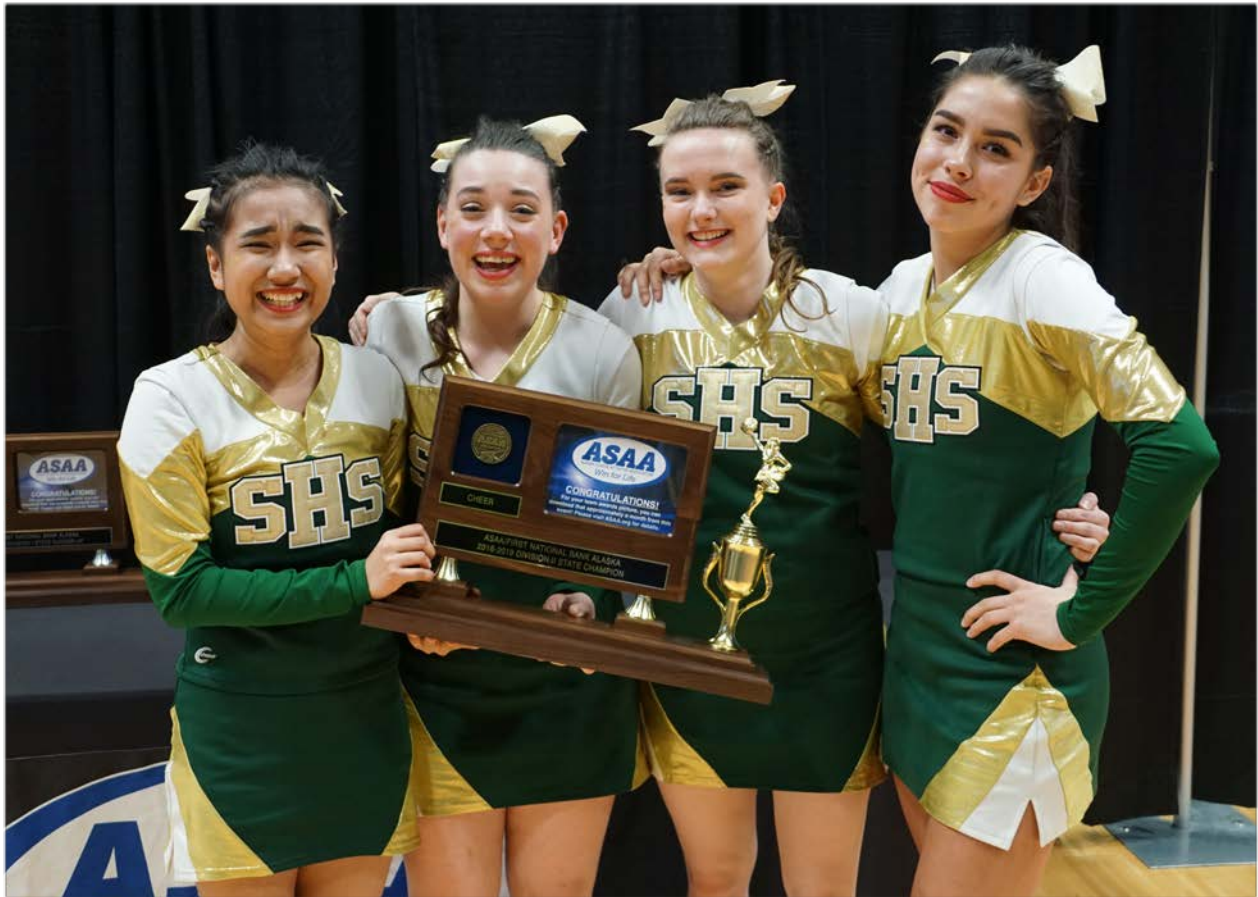




1A/2A Basketball State Championship Souvenir Program will not be printed this year. You can download the program for FREE at ASAA.org and ASAA365.com, and after the conclusion of March Madness Alaska you can order a totally completed souvenir program with results, tournament teams, etc. Northwest Designs web store is also available online at ASAA.org.

Awards: For classifications that have at least three cheer squads there will be a Cheer All-Tournament Team. This team will be awarded based on their performance during ASAA March Madness Alaska. 1A/2A/3A/4A awards will be at the conclusion of the Boys Championship game in each classification. Towards the conclusion of the boys championship game announcements will be made about the award ceremony to follow. At the end of the game, teams involved will be asked to join everyone on the floor. After the awards ceremony, the boys and girls basketball teams championship teams will be allowed to cut down the net.

Participation Fee: The Board of Directors has authorized the assessment of a participation fee for all state championships. The fee for cheer squads are \$10 per student participant. After the coaches meeting the roster will be considered final and schools will be invoiced that amount following the event.





ASAA MARCH MADNESS ALASKA GAME PROTOCOL

PRIOR TO GAME TIME

Warm-Ups: Each team is guaranteed 15 minutes of warm-up time prior to the game start. If the tournament is ahead of schedule, that time will be extended to the proper beginning game time. No game will begin before its scheduled time.

Team Introductions:

- First Game: The ENTIRE TEAM will be introduced before their game. All non-starters from each team will be announced first. Then starters from both teams alternating with visitor first, and home second.
- Rest of Games: Only the STARTERS will be introduced.
- State Championship Games: The ENTIRE TEAM will be introduced before their game.

Player & Coach Procedure During Introductions:

- Each starter is to meet at center court and shake hands with other starter, then return in front of team's bench.
- If a player wishes to shake the coach's hand, they should do so before reporting to center court.
- Head coaches should shake visiting player's hand. Head coaches will also shake hands when introduced.

National Anthem/Color Guard: The National Anthem will be performed at the times below. Teams on both courts will stand at attention for the presentation of colors and during the National Anthem performance. After the anthem, please remain at attention until the color guard has left the court.

Late/Absent Team Procedure: If a team is late to their scheduled game time due to weather or travel difficulties, arrangements will be made by tournament staff for the appropriate rescheduling of that game if at all possible. After the first day, if a team did not arrive by the end of the scheduled contests, that team will forfeit their game and be placed in the consolation round. If a team is late due to other reasons not related to weather or travel, the game may be delayed for a maximum of 15 minutes. After that period of time, if the team has not appeared and has not contacted ASAA, the game shall be recorded as a forfeit. A team arriving 0-15 minutes after their scheduled time of play will have a maximum of 5 minutes of warm up time.

Championship Games: Teams which qualify for the state championship games please talk to ASAA Associate Director Isaiah Vreeman before your Championship Game! There will be a special order and "show" for the championship games. Head Coaches will be required to give interviews before the game and there are other requirements as well, so be sure to speak with Isaiah Vreeman after you win your semifinal game.





ASAA MARCH MADNESS ALASKA GAME PROTOCOL

DURING THE GAME

Media Timeouts: There will be one (1) 60 second media timeout at the first dead ball after the 4:00 minute mark of both the 1st and 3rd quarters of every game.

Medical Procedure: Orthopedic Physicians of Anchorage are the Official Medical Provider for all ASAA state championship events. They will be present at all games throughout ASAA March Madness Alaska. OPA staff will wait to attend an athlete on the floor until they are called by a coach or official. OPA will wander over to your team side and be available to help. If there is a catastrophic injury or something very obviously wrong OPA will not wait for an official or coach to call them out. This is up to OPA.

Halftimes: All halftimes will be no longer than 10 Minutes EXCEPT the Championship halftimes will be 15 minutes. Regular game halftimes are planned for cheerleading performances and other activities. Championship Game Halftimes are planned for cheerleading performances, Alaska Airlines/GCI Paper Airplane Throw Off, and other special presentations. When the clock shows 3 minutes remaining, teams may return to the court for warm-ups. It is the responsibility of team personnel to notify teams when it's time to take the floor. If your team is not on the court, you will forfeit part of that warm-up time. All teams must return to their benches with one minute remaining.

Mercy Rule: The mercy rule is in effect during the entire tournament. Upon reaching a 40 or more point differential any time during the game, a running clock will be used. Once begun, the running clock will be stopped only for team, official, or injury time outs, and for technical fouls.

AFTER THE GAME

- All players and coaches will shake hands of the other team demonstrating good sportsmanship.
- Post Game Awards: The Good Sport Award will be given out on the first day of the tournament BEFORE the Players or Cheerleaders of the Game. Teams need to wait to exit the court on the first day until after ALL those awards are given out. Teams will wait until ALL post game awards are announced before exiting the court.
- Teams must clean up the bench area of all personnel items including jerseys, warm-ups, water bottles, towels, etc.
- Teams that play next shall wait until the teams that just played have exited the floor before approaching their assigned benches.
- Following each game, coaches and players will return to their locker room. Media will be allowed to approach teams AFTER award presentations following the game, and then after the team meeting and when the coaches give permission.
- After the boys championship games, both teams who just played will remain on the floor at their respective benches for the awards ceremony.
- Fans, spectators will not be allowed onto the court following the championship games. No liquid including water is permitted to be dumped onto the floor. Spray string is not allowed on the court. Any other celebratory material must be cleaned up by the winning team.
