ENTRIES:

- Students must meet all ASAA and school district eligibility standards.
- Students must be entered on the School Activities Reporting System (SARS).
- Students must qualify in every event they enter. They may enter up to 3 events (See DDF Handbook)
- Schools may enter up to 15 students. Only 3 entries per non-debate event, except Reader's Theatre and Extemporaneous Commentary, which are limited to 2 entries. No more than 9 total entries across all debate events.

CATEGORIES: The following events will be included, with awards going to the first 4 places

- Public Forum Debate
- Original Oration
- Extemporaneous Speaking United States
- Extemporaneous Speaking International
- Extemporaneous Commentary

- Reader's Theatre

TIMERS: We need timers. Let us know if you are available. Also, please encourage your students to volunteer when they are not competing.

COACHES: Please ensure that, at least, one coach is present with your students at all times throughout the tournament. This individual will be responsible for chaperoning your students, they may be called upon to serve as a judge or assist with other tournament functions. The name of the coach onsite must be provided to Shawn Briscoe (<u>shawn.debate@gmail.com</u>) no later than Wednesday, February 8th. If your school has more than one coach, please identify whether they both will be present at all times or will tradeoff. If trading off, please indicate who will be present each day/time.

EVENT SUPERVISION: Each participating school will be requested to identify an Administrator or other person approved in advance by the Principal who is responsible for the conduct of its coaches, participants and fans throughout the contest, as defined in the ASAA bylaws Article 6, Section 4. Please have the designees check in with ASAA staff upon arrival at the event.

PARTICIPATION FEE: The Board of Directors has authorized the assessment of a participation fee for all state championships and festivals. The fee for DDF is \$20 per student participant.

AWARDS: Awards are presented at the end of the tournament.

<u>Team Awards:</u> For Division I & Division II 1st and 2nd Place Team Trophies 1st place trophy in Debate, Drama, & Forensics Academic Award Sportsmanship Award

Individual Awards: Medals for $1^{st} - 4^{th}$ place in each event.
