

# **2025 ASAA MARCH MADNESS ALASKA**

**Basketball State Championships Policies & Procedures** 

February 20, 2025

**Qualifying Process:** Each classification has conference tournaments hosted by a school/s in that conference. At the conference tournaments state berths are decided. State berth allocations are on the <u>ASAA Basketball Regular Season Page</u> and the ASAA Handbook.

**State Championship Format, At-Large Berths & Seeding Process:** Basketball State Championship format, berths, and seeding processes can be found on the <u>ASAA Basketball Coaches</u> webpage.

**Brackets/Game Schedule & Results:** All brackets and schedules can be found on <u>ASAA Basketball Coaches</u> & <u>ASAA365.com</u>. Updated brackets will be available online at ASAA365.com.

**State Basketball Rules:** This event will be conducted in compliance with the 2024-2025 National Federation Basketball Rule Book.

**Mandatory Coaches Meeting:** There is a mandatory coaches meeting where important state and facility policies/procedures will be reviewed and questions answered. During 1A/2A practice time you can get your packet early from an ASAA Associate Director onsite.

**3A/4A:** Tuesday, Mar. 18 in the AAC Aux Gym - 5:30pm

**Basketballs:** Anaconda Sports "The Rock" basketball is the Official ASAA March Madness Alaska State Basketball Championships ball. They will be provided for team practices, pre-game warm-ups, and games. No balls may be taken to the locker room by teams.

**Rosters:** ASAA is using Big Teams for its School Activities Reporting System (SARS). Schools will need to submit rosters and indicate which students have qualified for state through this system. This can be done by accessing the hockey varsity roster.

- Teams must submit their state tournament roster via the School Activities Reporting System (SARS) no later than two weeks before the start of the tournament.
- This roster must include each athlete's uniform number. Player positions and height are not required, but will be included in the tournament program if provided.
- The Basketball Roster Limit is 12 players.

#### (3A/4A) TUE. MAR. 18 - 5:30PM

 Mandatory Coaches Meeting at the Alaska Airlines Center Aux Gym. Teams may include up to three (3) additional athletes beyond the maximum roster size when submitting their
roster. However, at the coaches' meeting, each team must finalize its official tournament roster by selecting 12
players from the listed 15. The remaining athletes must be scratched at the meeting, and the finalized roster must
be submitted to ASAA by the conclusion of the meeting. Once submitted, the roster is final, and no substitutions
will be permitted.

**Bench Area & Personnel Rules:** Each team's bench is limited to **14 seats**, with only one person per seat. No additional seating is allowed behind the bench. Bench personnel **must not exceed** the number of passes issued or the 14-seat limit.

- Roster Limit: Each team may have up to 12 players, with 5 on the court and up to 7 on the bench.
- **Bench Composition**: The remaining 7 seats may be occupied by a mix of coaches and managers, but the total number on the bench cannot exceed 14.
- **Authorized Personnel**: Only student participants/managers and adult coaching staff are permitted in bench area
- **Age Requirement**: To ensure safety, only individuals 7th grade or older with a valid pass may be on the bench during state championship games.
- **Clean-Up Policy**: Teams must clean their bench area after games, including cups, bottles, and trash. ASAA staff will inspect sidelines and locker rooms; schools may be billed for fines, damages, or cleaning costs.

**Team Passes:** Participating schools will receive state championship passes in accordance with the guidelines outlined in the State Championship Policies, Passes section of the ASAA Handbook (page 102).

**1A/2A Practice Schedule**: 1A Teams: Qualified teams will have a 30-minute practice on the split court in the main gym at the Alaska Airlines Center. 2A Teams: Qualified teams will have a 30-minute practice in the Aux Gym at the Alaska Airlines Center. Schedule & Adjustments: Teams may switch practice times only if both head coaches agree. The official schedule will be posted on the ASAA Basketball Coaches webpage by Monday.

**3A/4A Practice Availability:** ASAA will not provide practice time on competition floors on Tuesday. Schools seeking practice space may contact Anchorage School District, Grace Christian School, Mountain City Christian Academy, AVIS Alaska Sports Center (formerly UAA/Wells Fargo), or any other local gyms. Schools are responsible for arranging their own practice times with these facilities.

**Late/Absent Team Procedure:** In the event of delays caused by weather or travel disruptions, we will adhere to the Late Arrivals to State Championships policy, as detailed in the ASAA Handbook page 99.

**Alaska Airlines Center Opening Time:** Teams will be able to enter the Alaska Airlines Center one (1) hour prior to the FIRST GAME OF THE DAY. Courts will be open for the teams playing first, additionally, the track on the upper level.

**Team/Coach Entrance:** Teams and Coaching Staffs have a separate entrance to help elevate congestion and lines in the front entrance and bag checks. This entrance will be the doors on the far right side of the Main Doors. Please use this entrance.



**Player & Coach Bags:** Player and Coaches bags are subject to search when entering the Alaska Airlines Center. These searches will be conducted by the UAA University Police Department staff (UPD).

**Main Arena Floor Access:** The stairs to the main floor will be on your right once you enter the Team/Coach Entrance. AAC Security WILL be checking passes for everyone. Please make sure COACHES and PLAYERS have their pass. If you have trouble with accessing the stairs please ask an Alaska Airlines Center staff member.

# **UNIFORMS**

- The **HOME TEAM** is the **HIGHER SEEDED TEAM** and wears **WHITE**. When facing the court at the scorers table the HOME TEAM sits on the <u>RIGHT SIDE</u>.
- The **VISITING TEAM** is the **LOWER SEEDED TEAM** and wears **DARK COLOR**. When facing the court at the scorers table the VISITING TEAM sits on the LEFT SIDE.
- Please make sure to bring BOTH SETS of uniforms to all your games! Just in case there is an issue.

# **LOCKER ROOM POLICIES & ACCESS TIMING**

# 1A/2A Teams

- Access: Locker rooms will be available before your game, with team signs on the doors.
- Timing: Teams may access their assigned locker room AFTER HALFTIME of the PREVIOUS GAME
- **Belongings:** All belongings must be removed upon leaving for your game.
- **Post-Game Use:** Teams may return to the locker room for a post-game talk and will have access until halftime of the following game.

# 3A/4A Teams

#### Aux Gym Locker Rooms (160B & 160C)

- Access: Locker rooms will be available before your game, with team signs on the doors.
- Timing: Teams may access their assigned locker room AFTER HALFTIME of the PREVIOUS GAME
- **Belongings:** All belongings must be removed upon leaving for your game.
- **Post-Game Use:** Teams may return to the locker room for a post-game talk and will have access until halftime of the following game.

# Main Gym Locker Rooms (B13, B14, B51, B52)

- B13 & B14 Location: Near the elevators.
- **B51 & B52 Location**: Located in the northside back hallway.
- **Access:** Teams will have access throughout their game.
- Timing: Locker rooms will be opened by State Tournament Staff AT HALFTIME OF THE PRIOR GAME!
- Exit Policy: Teams must clear the locker room BEFORE HALFTIME OF THE GAME AFTER THIERS!
- Security: Locker room codes will not be provided; teams must request access from State Tournament Staff.

**Damage Liability:** Tournament staff and security will inspect locker rooms before and after team use. Schools will be held responsible for any damages and billed accordingly.

Hospitality: Events in the Alaska Airlines Center do not provide hospitality for coaches or school admin.

**Lost and Found:** Alaska Airlines Center has a "Lost & Found". Items that are turned in will be held for 2 weeks after the event. After that 2 weeks items that can will be donated, others will be thrown away.

**Team Parking:** ASAA is providing FREE parking at the Alaska Airlines Center. Please visit <u>ASAA Basketball Coaches</u> webpage or <u>ASAA365.com</u> for the Alaska Airlines Center Parking Map.

**1A/2A Skills Contest:** 1A Skills Contest will be March 11 at 5:30pm; 2A is March 12 at 5:30pm in the Alaska Airlines Center. The skills contest will feature a 3-point shooting contest and a bump contest between guards, forwards, and centers! Coaches please fill out the online form to submit your players names. They are not allowed to be substituted after your form is submitted. All participants will be required to wear identifying team apparel.

**Medical:** Orthopedic Physicians of Anchorage (OPA) is the official ASAA State Championships Medical provider. They will be onsite during the entire championship tournament to help provide medical help for injuries. Each team must provide all their own materials and supplies - including tape - if athletes are going to be taped.

**Concussion Information:** Please refer to the <u>ASAA Concussion Information</u> page on <u>ASAA.org</u>.

**Officials:** ASAA has selected certified officials for this event. Official nominations have come from hockey officials associations, coaches, school administrators, and other tournament site administrators. Every attempt is made to bring in qualified officials from around the state.

**Towels/Water:** Each team is responsible to provide bench towels. Additional towels for wiping floors, etc. will be provided. Water will be provided at each bench. BRING YOUR TEAM WATER BOTTLES, or a case of water.

**Event Supervision:** Each participating school will be requested to identify an administrator or other person approved in advance by the principal who is responsible for the conduct of its coaches, participants and fans throughout the contest, as defined in the ASAA bylaws Article 6, Section 4. Please have the designee check in with ASAA staff upon arrival at the event.

**Spectator Support Items | Artificial Noise Makers:** ASAA prohibits laser pointers, whistles, and any explosive devices or explosive sounds at ALL state championship events. Thunder sticks are NOT ALLOWED. Once play starts on EITHER COURT any artificial noise makers are not allowed.

**Sideline Cheerleaders**: If you have a sideline cheerleading squad they will be permitted at the end of the basketball floor within the marked-off section. Please consult the ASAA March Madness Alaska Sideline Cheerleading Policies and Procedures document found on the <u>ASAA Basketball Coaches</u> webpage

**Halftime Entertainment:** Sideline Cheer squads have time set aside to preform at halftime of their games. Other time is schedule by ASAA staff and sponsors.

**School Signs:** Schools are allowed to hang signs that are positive and directed only towards the schools team. Signs are <u>NOT ALLOWED TO BE HUNG WITH TAPE OR GLUE. BLUE PAINTERS TAPE IS WHAT YOU ARE ALLOWED TO USE.</u> Please remove your signage after each game!

**NFHS Network Streaming:** The NFHS Network will be webcasting ALL hockey games live on <u>NFHSnetwork.com</u>.

**Live Streaming is Strictly Prohibited:** ASAA holds exclusive broadcast rights for this event. Live streaming of games or any event programming, including through platforms such as Facebook Live or Instagram Live, is not allowed. Any rebroadcast or republication of event content is also prohibited. If tournament staff or security observes unauthorized live streaming, you will be asked to cease immediately. Failure to comply may result in removal from the venue. ASAA will actively monitor social media platforms for violations of this policy.

**Public Picture/Video:** Attendees are welcome to capture photos and short video clips of games and entertainment throughout the event. However, only ASAA Credentialed Media or Temporary Media are permitted to access non-spectator areas for photography or videography. All other individuals must remain in designated spectator areas. Spectators are strictly prohibited from entering the competition floor for the purpose of taking photos or videos. Event security and ASAA staff will enforce this policy and will remove individuals found in unauthorized areas.

**School/Team Event Video & Photography:** ASAA will not provide video or photography services for this event. Teams are encouraged to make their own arrangements if they wish to obtain video or photographs of their performances.

- **Team Video Recording:** Schools and teams are permitted to record their performances, provided the recording is not live-streamed. Student team managers or assistant coaches may handle video recording responsibilities.
- Photography: Special accommodations can be made for school yearbook staff or an adult approved by the school administration. Schools may request one (1) photography pass to gain access for team photography purposes. To request a pass, an email must be sent to <a href="media@asaa.org">media@asaa.org</a> by Tuesday at 2:00PM during the week of the state event. Once the request is received, ASAA will communicate with the school to provide further details, including designated areas for photography.

Only ASAA Credentialed Media, the ASAA Photographer, and ASAA-approved TV/Webcast production crews are authorized to take photos or videos outside spectator areas.

**Pep Bands Guidelines:** School pep bands and drum lines are encouraged to bring energy and excitement to the state championships! However, space is limited, and advance notice is required, walk-up requests will not be accommodated. Games in the Main Arena are allowed to have a Pep Band when there is not a split court. Games in the Aux Gym are NOT ALLOWED to have a Pep Band because of space issues. As this is a neutral-site event, participation must comply with the following guidelines:

#### <u>Requirements</u>

- Contact ASAA Associate Director, Isaiah Vreeman (isaiah@asaa.org), by 5:00PM the Monday before the event.
- · Administrators must verify the pep band typically performs at regular-season games for the team.
- Students must meet all ASAA eligibility requirements.
- Students must be listed on the school's pep band roster in the School Activities Reporting System.
- ASAA does not provide power for pep bands.

#### **Playing Guidelines**

• Directors must meet with the ASAA Associate Director or Game Announcer before their game to confirm playing times. A timeline will be provided if available.

#### **Permitted Playing Times**

• Before the game (as time allows).

- · During halftime/between periods (before or after performances/promotions).
- Between quarters/periods or timeouts, ensuring it doesn't interfere with coaches or ASAA promotions.
- After the game (as time allows).

# **Prohibited Playing Times**

- · During live game action.
- · Musical instruments cannot be used as noisemakers during contests.

# **Additional Notes**

- Neutral Site: Even if only one pep band is present, it cannot play for the entire warm-up period or halftime.
- · Non-Compliance: Failure to follow ASAA staff directions will result in a warning. Repeated violations will disqualify the band from performing for the remainder of the tournament.
- Participation Fees: Pep bands may be subject to applicable participation fees.

State Merchandise: Northwest Designs is the Official State Merchandise Vendor. NWD will have a large variety of apparel and feature on-site printing as well as a store at the ASAA.org homepage Northwest Designs Link.

Awards: Please review the ASAA Handbook Basketball Policies and Procedures State Championship section for a list of the awards.

Championship Team Net Cutting: Championship teams will be allowed to cut down the nets after the awards ceremony. However, because of the game schedule the net cutting celebration will be a limited time.



# **ASAA MARCH MADNESS ALASKA GAME PROTOCOL**

**Warm-Ups & Music:** Each team is guaranteed 15 minutes of warm-up time before the game. If the tournament is ahead of schedule, warm-up time will be extended to the scheduled game start time — no game will begin early. ASAA provides all warm-up and in-game music.

#### **Team Introductions:**

- First Game: The entire team will be introduced.
  - Non-starters will be announced first.
  - Starters will be introduced alternating, with the visiting team first, home team second.
- Remaining Games: Only starters will be introduced.
- State Championship Games: The entire team will be introduced. Visiting team first, then the Home team.

# **Player & Coach Procedure During Introductions:**

- Each starter meets at center court to shake hands with the opposing starter before returning to their bench.
- Players wishing to shake hands with their coach must do so before reporting to center court.
- Head coaches shake hands with all opposing starters and also shake hands with each other when introduced.

**National Anthem/Color Guard:** The National Anthem will be preformed at the times below. Teams on the court must stand at attention during the presentation of colors and the National Anthem.

#### **1A/2A Tournament**

- Wed Fri: 8am & 3:15pm
- Sat: 8am, 2pm (1A Girls), & 6:30pm (2A Girls)

#### **3A/4A Tournament**

- Wed: 8:00am & 3:15pm Thur: 10:30am & 3:15pm
- Fri: 9:30am & 3:15pm
- Sat: 8:00am, 1:30pm (3A Girls), & 5:30pm (4A Girls)

**Media Timeouts:** One (1) 70-second media timeout will be taken at the first dead ball after the 4:00-minute mark in the 1st and 3rd quarters of each game.

# **Halftime Policy**

- Standard halftime duration: 10 minutes
- State Championship Games: 15 minutes
- At 3 minutes remaining, teams may return to the court for warm-ups. Team personnel must notify teams. If a team is not on the court in time, they forfeit part of their warm-up period.
- All teams must be back at their benches with one minute remaining.

# **Post Game Procedure and Awards:**

- Players and coaches must shake hands with the opposing team as a sign of sportsmanship.
- Players and Cheerleaders of the Game will be awarded at the end of each game. Teams must remain on the court until all three awards have been presented.
- Teams playing next must wait until the previous teams have fully exited before approaching their benches.
- Bench Area Cleanup:
  - Teams must remove all personal items, including jerseys, warm-ups, water bottles, and towels.
  - No liquids (including water) may be dumped on the floor or in the locker rooms.
  - Spray string is NOT allowed. Any other celebratory material must be cleaned up by the winning team.

**Coach Post Game:** Interviews must take place off the court after any game. NFHS Network may request coaches for interviews. Teams advancing to the title game must meet with Isaiah Vreeman to review Championship Day details.
