# FOOTBALL 2025 ILLEGAL VS. IMPROPERLY WORN EQUIPMENT PENALTY PROGRESSION

#### ILLEGAL EQUIPMENT

- \*15-yard Unsportsmanlike penalty assessed to the Head Coach
- \*A second violation results in a 15-yard UNS and disqualification of the Head Coach
- -Eye shields must be clear, no tint.
- -Eye shade as defined in 1-5-3c or that extends outside the eye socket or below the cheek bone.
- -Rib/Back pads must be covered
- -Jewelry (Necklaces, earrings, friendship bracelets etc.)
- -Arm/calf bands
- -Jerseys, undershirts or exterior arm covers/pads manufactured to enhance contact with the football or opponent.
- -Play cards not worn on the wrist or arm.
- -Equipment not worn as intended by the manufacturer.
- -A mouthpiece with attachments that do not serve a purpose or pose a safety risk or word(s) other than a manufacturer's logo.
- -If a player is properly wearing a mouthpiece while subsequently has an additional mouthpiece secured to the facemask or other helmet opening.
- -Any audio or video device worn by a player.







#### **IMPROPERLY WORN EQUIPMENT**

- -Tuck in the jersey if it reaches below the waistline.
- -Undershirts must be tucked in.
- -Pants must cover the knees.
- -Pads (knee, thigh, tail) must not be altered from the manufacturer's original design.
- -Chinstrap must be secured at 4 points.
- -Mouthpiece must be in.





### Team's 1<sup>st</sup> Offense: (Player removed for one play to correct the equipment)

1-5-ART. 5... When any required player equipment is missing or worn improperly, an official's time-out shall be declared. If the missing or improperly worn equipment is detected during the down or subsequent dead-ball action related to the down without being directly attributable to a foul by an opponent or if a player is wearing otherwise legal equipment in an illegal manner, the player shall be replaced for at least one down, unless halftime intermission or an overtime intermission occurs. If proper and legal equipment has become improperly worn through use but prompt repair is possible and does not delay the ready-for-play for more than 25 seconds, such repair may be made without replacing the player for at least one down. (3-5-2b, 3-5-5b, 3-5-7e, 3-5-10d, 3-5-10e)

## <u>Team's 2<sup>nd</sup> & Subsequent Offenses: (Delay of game penalty & player removed for one play to correct the equipment)</u>

3-6-ART. 2 . . . Action or inaction which prevents promptness in putting the ball in play is delay of game. This includes:

e. Any other conduct which unduly prolongs the game.

PENALTY: Arts. 2a-f, 4 - Delay of game -(S7-21) - 5 yards;
