FORMAT:

The tournament is an 8 team single elimination, consolation bracket.

RULES:

2025-26 National Federation of High School (NFHS) Soccer rules apply. Overtime Policy;

- First round & winner side of the bracket will follow the NFHS adopted overtime procedure (page 90 Rules Book).
- Consolation side of the bracket will follow the tie breaker penalty kick procedure.

ROSTER SUBMISSION

- Thursday, May 14 by 5:00PM initial rosters submitted in Bigteams.
- Roster must include uniform numbers and indicate who will be attending State.
- Roster limit is 22. Teams are allowed to list up to 3 additional athletes on the roster. If tournament roster has more than 22 players, you will need to turn in a game roster for each game indicating the 22 players in uniform.
- The official tournament roster is finalized at the coaches meeting.

FORMS

Forms are accessed through Bigteams. When you are logged into your account click on **Document Management**, click on the **General State Entry Form** and **Start a New Submission**. Please complete the photo upload, the Code of Conduct and the Good Sport Selection forms. Complete all 4 forms by 2pm on Sunday, May 24.

Nike will be the official state tournament ball. Please bring your own balls for warm-up.

WARM-UP AREA:

Teams are allowed to warm up before their game behind the soccer goals far enough away not to interfere with the play on the field. Soccer balls are not allowed in this area while games are in progress. There are additional fields at each site that can be used for warm up with soccer balls.

HOME/VISITOR:

Home team will be the higher seed, will sit on the left side when facing the field from the official area and will wear dark jerseys and socks. Visiting team will sit on the right side when facing the field from the official area and will wear white jerseys and socks.

TEAM AREA

- ONLY student participants, managers, and adult coaching staff are allowed in the bench area.
- The maximum number of individuals in the team area is 28.
- All individuals must be wearing their pass or be in uniform.
- Due to safety concerns only individuals 7th grade age or above may be in the team area during competition.
- Please clean up the bench area after your game.

STADIUM RULES: All sites have basic rules for their turf fields:

- NO FOOD/DRINK (besides water) allowed on field or sidelines
- NO SUNFLOWER SEEDS
- NO GUM
- NO BIKES or SKATEBOARDS
- NO FIELD HEATERS OF ANY TYPE ARE ALLOWED (gas/electrical/etc.).
- Only service dogs with proper documentation are allowed in the bleachers

WATER:

Participants should have their own water bottles.

PASSES

- Issued to certified coaches and rostered participants.
- Admin passes available on arrival
- Fines issued for misuse: \$25 for coaches, \$10 for participant

EVENT SUPERVISION:

Each school must designate an administrator to oversee team and fan conduct. Check in with ASAA staff required (ASAA bylaws Article 6, Section 4, State Championship Policies #22)

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEO TAPING:

ASAA credential media only allowed outside the spectator area. Schools may request special arrangements for a team photographer.

SPECTATOR ETIQUETTE: All spectators are restricted to the spectators areas. The tournament/meet director and ASAA officials are empowered to remove anyone displaying unacceptable conduct from the area and may temporarily suspend the tournament, if necessary.
