Julie Weber Named 2025–2026 ASAA Official of the Year

For more than three decades, Weber has played a significant role in the development and success of the sport as a player, coach, official, educator, and administrator. A standout student-athlete at the University of Alaska Anchorage from 1992–1997, she competed in both volleyball and basketball before transitioning into coaching with the Seawolves volleyball program. From 1997–2006, Weber served as a graduate assistant and later assistant volleyball coach, helping mentor and develop student-athletes at the collegiate level.

Since beginning her officiating career in 2007, Weber has earned statewide respect as one of Alaska’s premier volleyball officials. She has served as an NFHS official, rules interpreter, head official, and assigner while also contributing extensively at the collegiate and club levels through PAVO and USA Volleyball.

In addition to her officiating accomplishments, Weber has been instrumental in growing the sport through her leadership with Midnight Sun Volleyball and her service as Alaska’s USA Volleyball Regional Commissioner. Her commitment to mentorship and education has positively impacted generations of athletes, coaches, and officials across the state.
