

MIXED 6 RULES

The National Federation Rules in general shall govern play for females and males on the same team with the following exceptions:

- 1. Mixed-Six volleyball is intended to be played with three males and three females on the court at all times. The serving order an positions on the floor shall alternate. If a male position is the first server, the positions shall be male, female, male, female, male, female. If a female position is the first server, the positions shall be female, male, female, male, female, male.
 - a. In the event that three male player are not available (not on the roster, not at the playing site, not academically eligible, or not able to play because of injury or illness), then a female may fill a male position. A female shall never replace an available male player because of skill level or performance.
 - **b.** A male may never fill a female position.

Activities

- **c.** No more than three males may be on the court at any time.
- **d.** There must be at least one male on the court to begin a match.
- **2.** The height of the net for mixed-six play shall be 2.43 meters (7' 11-5/8").
- 3. When the ball is played more than once by a team, at least one of the contacts shall be made by a female player. Contact of the ball during blocking shall not constitute a play on the ball under this rule. There is no requirement for a male player to contact the ball, regardless of the number of plays by a team.
- **4.** Uniforms of players shall be identical within the following provisions:

- a. All females shall be attired in identical jerseys and shorts or one-piece uniform.
- **b.** All males shall be attired in identical jerseys and shorts or one-piece uniform.
- 5. When only one male player position is in the front row at service, one male back-row player position may be forward of the attack line for the purpose of blocking. The remaining back-row male player must be behind the attack line until the ball has been contacted by the block or has been hit in such a manner that no block is possible. If a male back-row player is not forward of the attack line for the purpose of blocking, there is no restriction on both back-row male players being forward of the attack line.
 - **a.** Male back-row players when playing the ball in other than blocking actions shall be governed by provisions of the National Federation Rule 9, Section 5, Art 5b which states: "a back-row player shall not attack a ball which is completely above the height of the net while positioned:
 - On or in front of the attack line or its out-of-bounds extension.
 - 2) In the air, having left the floor on or in front of the attack line or its out-of-bounds extension.
 - **b.** No female back-row player may participate in a block.
- **6.** The Libero Player will not be used in Mixed Six matches.





EVOLUTION OF VOLLEYBALL IN ALASKA

State Volleyball had its start as the "Western Alaska Girls Volleyball Tournament" in 1971. Only eight teams attended the first two years. In 1973, the tournament expanded to twelve teams and was hosted by Dimond. Teams were seeded at random because of the different number of games played prior to the tournament. The first ASAA sanctioned State Tournament was held sometime after 1973. Until 1980, the matches were best two out of three.

Starting with the 1985 season, ASAA created separate divisions for the smaller sized schools. Those with enrollments 100-400 now competed for their own championship, while schools below 100 had their own tournament. This changed again in 1987-88 when all schools below 400 competed for one championship. In 1991, both championships were held at the same site for the first time—Bartlett High School—and Lee Johnson was the tournament director.

VOLLEYBALL IN ALASKA INCREASED IN POPULARITY OVER THE NEXT 8 YEARS RESULTING IN A MAJOR CHANGE.

For the 1997-98 season, schools in Regions 1 and 2 were grouped into a classification known as 1A-2A. 3A Schools in the North and Western part of Alaska also joined this


division as the season was more conducive to their school year and backhaul with wrestling. In addition, a number of small schools who could not field a full girls team began com-

peting coed in a classification known as "Mixed Six".


The coed division began with only four teams qualifying to the state tournament and Golovin winning the Championship. By 2002, the popularity of this new format increased to the point that eight teams qualified out of six conferences.

In 2009, all the 3A-West schools returned to the early fall schedule leaving the 1A/2A schools with the Mixed Six schools. Presently, the 3A and 4A schools season starts in early August and ends in mid-November. The 1A and 2A and Mixed Six Division start in late September and finish in early December.
