HISTORY OF SOFTBALL IN ALASKA

As more schools began having softball teams, ASAA created the first state tournament in 1996. All schools were in one classification and, since it was an emerging sport, qualification to the state tournament was dependent on a team's season record. If a team had a .500 average or higher, regardless of the number of games they played, they qualified for a berth. This meant that no one knew how many teams would actually compete until the last week. Sometimes as few as eight but as many as fourteen teams might attend the state tournament. The tour-

namment bracket was a double elimination format which might require some teams to play as many as four or five games within 24 hours.

In 2005, with twenty-five schools now having softball as a varsity sport, it was time to divide into a Large Schools Classification (850+ enrollment) and a Small Schools Classification (under 850 enrollment). This change not only addressed the growth in the number of smaller schools playing softball, but also the inequity of playing in one

tournament against schools much larger. Schools could still qualify by having a .500 record against teams only in their own classification. However, in 2006, schools were grouped into conferences with a certain number of berths assigned to each conference. Presently, there are 15 schools in the large school classification that get eight berths to state. And there are eleven schools in the small school classification that are assigned six berths.

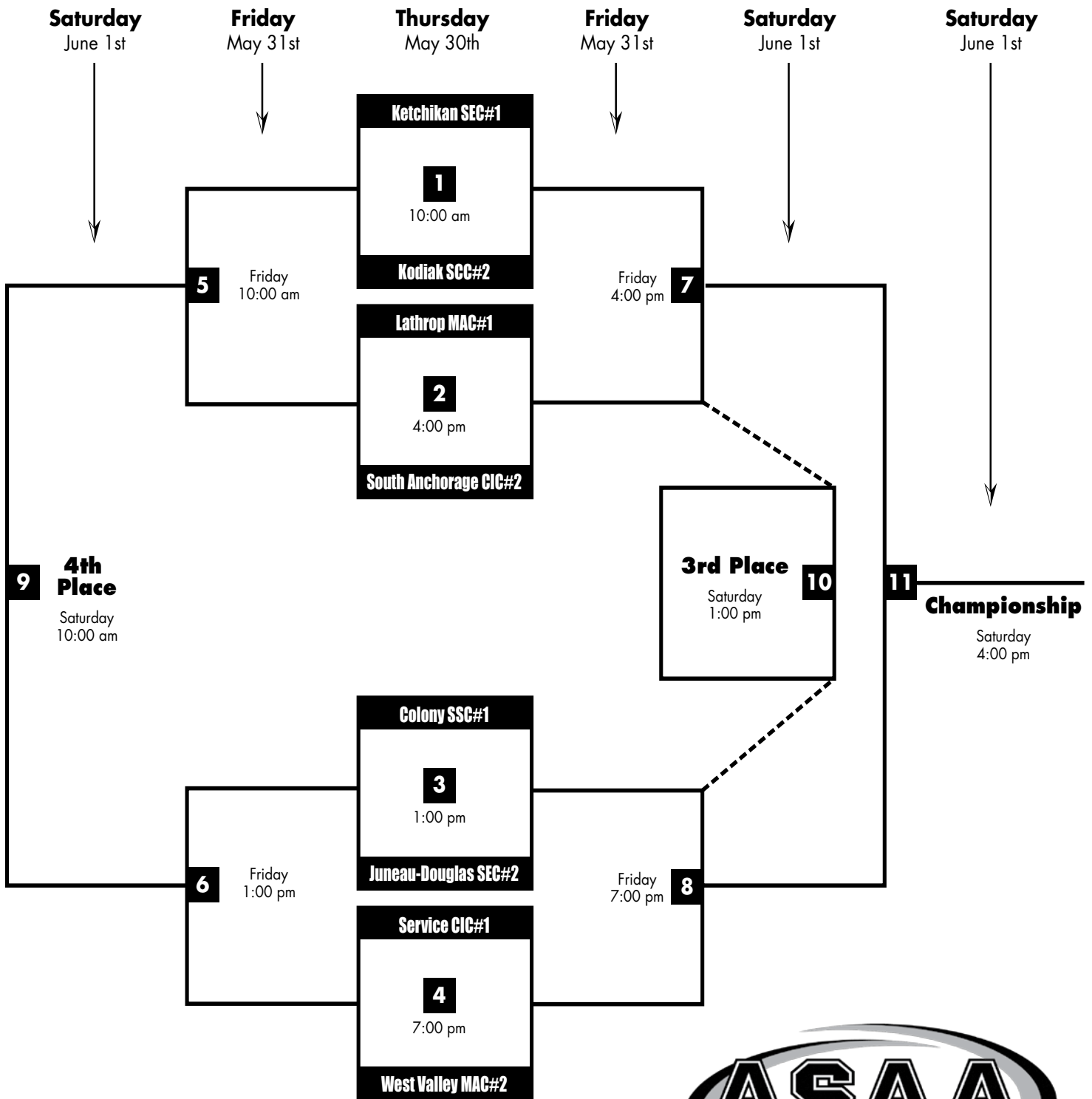

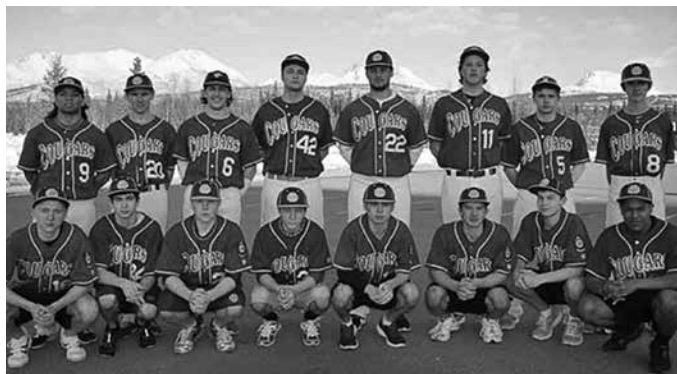

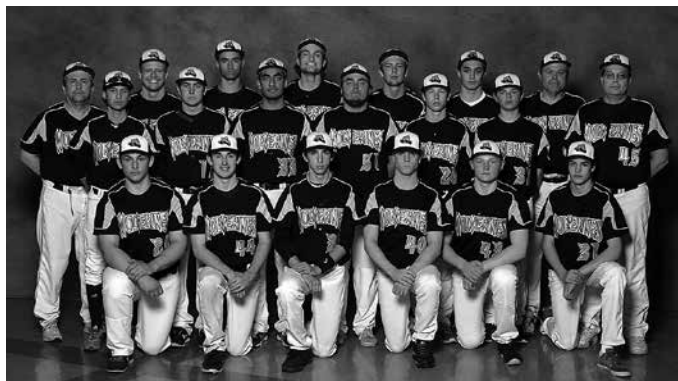

HISTORY OF BASEBALL IN ALASKA

For many years, baseball was played as a preparation for American Legion Baseball. Teams in Anchorage and Fairbanks were basically feeder programs for the summer long club programs. As interest developed in more schools, ASAA created the first state tournament in 2000. At that time, there were about twelve schools in four regions in the state. Since then, the

sport has been adopted by more schools— in many cases as an “outsourced” program as schools were unable to fund additional sports.

The first six state tournaments involved only the top team from four different conferences to play two semi-finals, a third place game and a championship. Starting with 2007, the tour-

namment expanded into a regulation eight-team championship that included two teams from each of the four conferences. Presently, there are 30 schools with baseball programs throughout Alaska.
