

#### **MEG HULLEY FRAZIER**

Dr. Meg Hulley Frazier, Rita O. Huntsinger Distinguished Professor of Music, has held the position of Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Music at Loyola University New Orleans since 1998; she also serves as Chair of Vocal Studies. A native of Longview, Texas, Dr. Frazier earned Bachelor of Music Education (voice and piano concentration) and

Master of Music degrees at Sam Houston State University and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in choral conducting at LSU.

At Loyola, Dr. Frazier conducts the university's three choral ensembles and teaches conducting and choral music education methods. Loyola choirs have performed at state and regional conventions of the American Choral Directors Association, at Carnegie Hall, and an European tour.

In addition to her work at Loyola, Dr. Frazier is also an active professional conductor; she is a regular collaborator with the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra and the New Orleans Opera Association. Dr. Frazier is in her 11th season as the Artistic Director/Conductor for NOVA (New Orleans Vocal Arts), whose three choral ensembles present a wide array of concerts each season. Dr. Frazier has conducted high school honor choirs in twelve states, including all-state choirs in Louisiana, Kentucky, Florida, and Tennessee. This is Dr. Frazier's first visit to Alaska, and she is super pleased that it is in conjunction with working with the fantastic women of the Treble All-State Choir!

#### STAN McGILL

Stan McGill taught 33 years in secondary choral music education in Texas and Missouri, Professional positions include Texas Music Educators Association Vocal Chair, and President of both TMEA and Southwest American Choral Directors Association. He has served on numerous TMEA, TCDA and ACDA committees including Program for the 2009, 2013 & 2017 National ACDA Conferences. He is active as

an adjudicator, speaker, director and clinician throughout the United States.

He was one of four national authors for the Warner Brothers Music Expression Textbook for Secondary Choirs. Mr. McGill, along with co-author Dr. Morris Stevens, wrote "90 Days to Sightreading Success" and "Another Sightreading Success" available through AMC Publications. Their middle school sight reading methods book "18 Lessons to Sightreading Success" is available through Hal Leonard. His choral methods book "Beyond Singing", is also published by Hal Leonard and co-authored with Elizabeth Volk. His choral arrangements are available through Shawnee Press and he is editor of the Stan McGill Choral Series with Hal Leonard.

Mr. McGill has had extensive leadership service with ACDA and his articles have been published in the Southwestern Musician, Common Times, Choral Journal, and Texas Sings. He has directed numerous honor choirs including all state choirs in Alaska, Arkansas, Connecticut, Kentucky, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and South Carolina. He directed the the 2008 SWACDA 8-10 Boys Honor Choir in Kansas City. His choirs have performed nine times for TMEA, SWACDA and National ACDA Conventions and have made 3 European tours.

A native of Sikeston, Missouri, Mr. McGill graduated from William Jewell College and received his master's degree from Arizona State University.

#### **CHRISTOPHER LUTHER**

Violist, violinist, conductor, arranger, and devoted pedagogue, Dr. Christopher Luther has established himself as a uniquely gifted performer and teacher through his diverse musical background and uncanny ability to reach and inspire youth.

As a violist, Luther's primary instructors were Donald McInnes and Roger Myers. He received his Doctorate of Musical Arts in Viola Performance from the Butler School of Music at the University of Texas. He received his Masters Degree from the Thornton


School of Music at the University of Southern California in violin performance under the tutelage of Eudice Shapiro and Martin Chalifour. Born in Denver, he began his performance career at the age of eight, fiddling at the Colorado Renaissance Festival. Since then, he has continued his diverse musical training with an undergraduate degree in Violin Performance and Jazz studies from the Lamont School of Music at the University of Denver.

Luther produced his first CD entitled Personality consisting of virtuosic bluegrass music supported by jazz concepts including original compositions. In Los Angeles Luther has played in soundtracks with a few on-screen performances, most notably in The Soloist. He collaborated with artists including Burt Bacharach, Stevie Wonder, Natalie Cole, Patti Austin, Ruben Studdard, James Moody, Jon Faddis, Nancy Wilson, Richard Green and many others including a performance on the Jay Leno Show with Sarah Barrielles.

Luther is violin and viola faculty at the Montecito International Music Festival in Southern California. He is the co-founder and co-director of Rocky Mountain Fiddle Camp in Colorado (rmfiddle.com). Luther is also the founder and director of the annual Colorado Viola Celebration, held at the University of Northern Colorado.

Luther is in demand as an all-state clinician and guest artist as he is able to teach, perform, and connect classical and folk traditions to all ensemble sizes.

In addition to the Assistant Professor of Viola appointment at the University of Northern Colorado, Luther added Alternative Styles to the string curriculum, making it one of few schools in the nation to offer such program diversity.

#### PETER LOEL BOONSHAFT


Called one of the most exciting and exhilarating voices in music education today, Peter Loel Boonshaft has been invited to speak or conduct in every state in the nation and around the world. Honored by the National Association for Music Education and Music For All as the first recipient of the "George M. Parks Award for Leadership in Music Education," Dr. Boonshaft has recently been named Director of Education for Jupiter Band Instruments. He has received official proclamations from the Governors of five states and a Certificate of Appreciation from former President Ronald Reagan, as well as performing for former President and Mrs. George H. W. Bush, former President Bill Clinton, and for Margaret Thatcher, former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom. He has been awarded membership in Pi Kappa Lambda and Alpha Chi, as well as twice receiving the University of Hartford Regent's Award and that University's Outstanding Music Educator Award. His honors also include being selected three times as a National Endowment for the Arts "Artist in Residence," three times awarded Honorary Life Membership in the Tri-M Music Honor Society, and being selected for the Center for Scholarly Research and Academic Excellence at Hofstra University.

He holds Bachelor of Music (Summa Cum Laude), Master of Music Education in Conducting, and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees. Dr. Boonshaft was also awarded a Connecticut General Fellowship for study at the Kodály Musical Training Institute, from which he holds a Certificate. He is currently on the faculty of Hofstra University in Hempstead, New York, where he is Professor of Music and Director of Bands. He is Conductor of the Hofstra University Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band, and professor of conducting and music education. Prior to this appointment, Dr. Boonshaft was on the faculty of Moravian College and the University of Hartford. He was Founder and Music Director of the Pennsylvania Youth Honors Concert Band and the Connecticut Valley Youth Wind Ensemble. In addition, he held the post of Music Director and Conductor of the Metropolitan Wind Symphony of Boston.

Dr. Boonshaft is the author of the critically acclaimed best-selling books Teaching Music with Passion, Teaching Music with Purpose, and Teaching Music with Promise, as well as his first book for teachers of other disciplines, Teaching with Passion, Purpose and Promise. He is also co-author of Alfred Music Publishing's new beginning method book series, Sound Innovations for Band and Sound Innovations for Strings, as well as Sound Innovations: Ensemble Development for Intermediate Concert Band and Sound Innovations: Ensemble Development for Advanced Concert Band. In addition, he is the author of Vaclav Nelhybel: His Life and Works, the only authorized biography of the composer, a contributing author of The Music Director's Cookbook: Creative Recipes for a Successful Program, and author of articles for Instrumentalist Magazine, the National Band Association Journal, Teaching Music, and Band Director's Guide. Dr. Boonshaft also holds the post of Band/Wind Ensemble Editor for the School Music News. Active as a proponent of new literature for concert band, he has commissioned and conducted over forty world premieres by such notable composers as Eric Ewazen, W. Francis McBeth, Johan de Meij, Fisher Tull, H. Owen Reed, Vaclav Nelhybel, David Gillingham, Philip Sparke, Satoshi Yagisawa, Rossano Galante, Sam Hazo, Andrew Boysen, Brian Hogg, Robert W. Smith, David Holsinger, Stephen Melillo, Roland Barrett, and Jared Spears. Among the soloists who have appeared in performance with Dr. Boonshaft are John Marcellus, Maynard Ferguson, Harvey Phillips, The Boston Brass, Eugene Rousseau, Marianne Gedigian, Ed Shaughnessy, Lynn Klock, Don Butterfield, The Dallas Brass, Dave Steinmeyer and the United States Air Force "Airmen of Note," Chester Schmitz, and the Vienna Schubert Trio.

Extremely active as a guest conductor, clinician and speaker for conferences, festivals, concerts and workshops nationally and internationally, he has guest conducted the NAfME (The National Association for Music Education) National High School Honors Band, NAfME All-Eastern Band, NAfME All-Eastern Directors Band, Goldman Memorial Band, U.S. Marine Corps Forces Pacific Band, U.S. Marine Band New Orleans, Western International Band Clinic, Prague Castle Guard/Czech Police Symphonic Band, U.S. Department of Defense Dependents Schools: Europe Honors Music Fest Band, and the Association of Concert Bands National Conference Band. In addition, he has been an adjudicator and clinician for the Music For All/Bands of America National Concert Band Festival. He has served as a speaker for the Canadian Music Educators Association National Convention, NAfME National Conference, American Band College, Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic, Music For All/Bands and Orchestras of America Symposium, Samuel Barber Institute for Music Educators, Music Education Center of America, East Asia Regional Council of Schools in China, Singapore Ministry of Education Band Conference, KIPP National School Summit, NESA Council of Overseas Schools Conferences in Thailand and The Philippines, and as keynote speaker for the NAfME Northwest Division Conference, NAfME Southern Division Conference, European Music Educators Convention, National Convention of the American String Teachers Association, National Convention of the American School Band Directors Association, ACDA Western Division Conference, Maryborough Music Conference of Australia, National Conference of the Organization of American Kodály Educators, and numerous international, national, state and regional music education conferences.
