For Sitka senior, basketball is 'in her blood'

For the average person, there are certain things that just come natural. Eating. Sleeping. Breathing.

Zoe Krupa can add basketball to that list.

"She's got it in her blood," Sitka head coach Sondra Lundvick said recently. "Both of her parents played in college. Both have coached her entire life."

Krupa grew up on the court, with a basketball in her hands.

"It's one thing if the kid's a gym rat. This kid goes to the next level. She's super committed," Lundvick said.

And that commitment to the game as allowed Krupa to become one of the best of the state. Krupa has been named first-team all-state by the Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches. It's the second straight year that Krupa has landed on the first team. Krupa, who helped Sitka capture the 2015 3A girls state title, recently led the Wolves to a Southeast Conference crown.

"She's really been a team leader," Lundvick said. "She leads us in scoring, but she does so many other things for us."

Lundvick said Krupa's many abilities allow to her to be an asset in a variety of different ways.

"She's a good defender, our best rebounder. She can handle the ball for us. She can do it all," Lundvick said.



And it all goes back to the commitment to the game, Lundvick said.

"She plays other sports, but you can always find her in the gym shooting," Lundvick said of Krupa, who is averaging 15 points and 11 rebounds per game.

Lundvick also lauded Krupa's character.

"Zoe is such a nice kid. She has such a kind heart," Lundvick said. "She aspires to be a special education teacher. She works closely with the special (education) department at our schools. It's really neat to see her interact with the kids with special needs."





He spent a lot of hours working on his shot

During the regular season, Tobin Karlberg shot 62 percent from the field. It's a number you might see from a big man who makes his living in the paint. But for the statistic is even more impressive for Karlberg, Grace Christian School's junior standout, a player who can score anywhere on the floor.

Raising his shooting percentage was a focus for Karlberg, Grace Christian head coach Jason Boerger said recently.

"He spent a lot of hours working on his shot," Boerger said.

And the work paid off. Karlberg averaged 24.8 points per game during the regular season, while shooting 62 percent. The standout point guard also shot 51 percent from three-point range.

"He raised his three-point percentage nine points from last year," Boerger said.

And the work ethic and production are among the reasons why Karlberg is being recognized as the best in the state. Karlberg has been named the Alaska Roof Coatings/Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches 3A Player of the Year.

"He's a great kid. He always stays after. He always wants to talk to the coaches," Boerger said of Karlberg, who was also named first-team all-state as a sophomore. "He's always looking to get the feedback and improve. He's really been a delight to coach. I'm blessed to have him on my team."

Despite scoring nearly 25 points per game, Boerger



said Karlberg is also selective with his shot.


"He doesn't shoot a lot. He's incredibly efficient," Boerger said. "He's fun to watch."

Karlberg also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 4.4 assists and 4 steals during the regular season.


In addition to all of his ability, Boerger said there are intangibles that stick out.

Wasilla coach calls senior 'one of the most underrated players in the state'

WASILLA — McKenna Dinkel spent a portion of her prep career flying underneath the radar.

Playing alongside first-team all-state selections, Dinkel may not have drawn the bulk of the attention during her run as a four-year varsity player with the Wasilla Warriors. But Dinkel found success in whatever role she was assigned. And now as a senior, Dinkel can't be overlooked. Dinkel currently leads the defending Northern Lights Conference and 4A state champions in both scoring and rebounding.

"She's probably one of the most underrated players throughout the state," Wasilla head coach Jeannie Hebert-Truax said of Dinkel recently. "People just don't take notice of her."

But Hebert-Truax and the Warriors know exactly what Dinkel brings to a squad. Entering the NLC tournament, Dinkel led the Warriors with 13.5 points and 7.8 rebounds per game. The forward is also shooting 54 percent from the floor, a team-high, and even leads the squad shooting 41 percent from behind the arc. Dinkel has knocked down 17 threes this season, third best on the team.

Dinkel is third on the team with 58 steals and fourth with 44 assists.

And now Dinkel is getting more recognition. After earned NLC Player of the Year honors, Dinkel has been named first-team all-state by the Alaska Association of Basketball Coaches.

Hebert-Truax said Dinkel has shown versatility throughout her career, and can help the team in a variety of ways. Earlier in her career, Dinkel was looked to as a player that needs to rebound and defend. As she became a veteran, the team began to depend on her more on the offensive end. This year, Hebert-Truax said Dinkel has become a threat inside and out.



"She can post up. We can pull her out to the perimeter. She also has a pretty good midrange game," Hebert-Truax said.

As the Warriors dealt with injuries, Hebert-Truax said the coaches even put together a package that includes Dinkel working at the point guard spot, and bringing the ball up the floor.

Hebert-Truax said Dinkel's basketball I.Q. allows the Warriors to use the senior in so many different roles.

"She knows and understands the game of basketball," Hebert-Truax said. "One of her major attributes is she understands the game. Not just her position, but everyone else's position too."





Jno-Lewis said Miller could always shoot the ball, but that’s now just a piece of Miller’s skill set.

“He can affect the game in so many different ways,” Jno-Lewis said. “His game has evolved.”

Jno-Lewis said Miller now scores in a variety of different ways, he defends. Maybe most important, Jno-Lewis said, Miller makes everyone around him better.

“He’s not as vocal as some of the guys I’ve



coached in the past. He’s very quiet, very humble. But Moses leads by example,” Jno-Lewis said.

Jno-Lewis said the overall growth of Miller and evolution of his game is a big reason why East has been seen among the top teams in the state this season.

Jno-Lewis said Miller is preparing for a career at the next level, and certainly sees potential for the 6-foot-11 senior guard.

“The sky’s the limit,” Jno-Lewis said of Miller, who was also named the CIC Player of the Year following the regular season.


