# 1992 SMALL SCHOOL CHAMPION FLASHBACK

## Eielson Ravens

Football 20-Year Flashback – 1992 Eielson Ravens State Football Champions

Ravenous feast for tiny Eielson Ravens rip Star for football title

One of the smallest football schools in the state was standing tallest Saturday afternoon.

Eielson, with an enrollment of just 314 students but sporting Alaska's winningest football coach, defeated Soldotna 28-9 to become the first team from outside Anchorage Cook Inlet Conference to win the state championship.

Frank Brown rushed for 152 yards and two touchdowns to give the 2,000 fans at Anchorage Football Stadium a look at Alaska football history: a state title of the head coach Buck Nystrom and the 9-0 Eielson Ravens.

"It seems fitting that in the year Anchorage schools are dethroned, the smallest school in the state wins it," said Nystrom.

Actually, Nikiski has about 10 fewer students than Eielson to claim the "smallest school" honor, but it's amazing that a tiny school from an Air Force Base in Fairbanks could house the best football team in the state.

But it's been that way all season – Eielson had been ranked No. 1 in the Daily News/Coaches Prep Football Poll since the second week of the regular season – and it was that way from the start on Saturday.

Brown finished off a five-play drive with a 34-yard scamper around the right end to give Eielson a quick 7-0 lead with only 2 minutes, 14 seconds ticked off the clock. From that point on the game was 1) Brown rushing through the Star defense for an average of 8.9 yards per carry; 2) Soldotna's passing game being thwarted by interceptions and dropped passes; and 3) Eielson quarterback Mike Leonard finding sophomore wide out Lamont Ford open deep.

"We just couldn't keep up with their speed," said Soldotna head coach Bob Boudreaux whose teams have now lost four state championship games. "We had our changes with the big play but we dropped them."

Instead, it was the Ravens who came up with the big plays to end a spectacular season with a win.

Eielson tore through its Railbelt Conference schedule unbeaten, outscoring opponents by an average of 33 points per game, never trailing in any of them, and racking up rushing numbers you wouldn't believe: nearly 2,000 yards and 31 touchdowns from the running back trio of Brown, Travis Hill, and Dedric Campbell.

"But we had to be ready for this one," said Brown. "We had to keep tight and up for the whole game. That's the way I ran, with intensity and power."

With the Stars keying on Hill – Eielson's leading rusher for the season – the Ravens took what was given to them: running room for Brown, a fifth year senior playing because a judge's temporary restraining order kept him on the team for most of the season.

Brown's eligibility won't be decided until the State Board of Education meets Saturday. But even if Brown is declared ineligible, there is no restitution rule to take away Eielson's state crown.

And, no one was taking anything away from the 5-foot-9, 195-pounder Saturday afternoon. Brown's repeatedly blew through the Soldotna defense on misdirection counter plays, leaving the Stars to chase after him.

"Travis would go one way and I'd go another, and it'd open up," explained Brown. The Ravens didn't just win it on the ground though. Leonard, a 6-5 junior,

completed four of six passes for 135 yards and two touchdowns by faking the run, then catching the Star defense off-guard by throwing long.

Late in the second quarter, Leonard threw 28 yards to Ford for Eielson's second touchdown of the game and a 14-0 Raven lead. "We'd do that on first down," said Nystrom. "Do it when they least expect it."

The contest looked like another state championship rout after that – even though Soldotna was making an effort. It was just that the Stars couldn't finish off their drives.

On Soldotna's second quarter possession, Star quarterback Mikah Boudreaux hit a wide open Darin Kellum in the hands – a combination that hooked up 36 times this season – for a sure touchdown, but Kellum couldn't hang on to the ball.

Two plays later Ford tipped a Boudreaux pass and Eielson lineman Jim Morowski intercepted it at the Soldotna 41-yard line. On Soldotna's next drive – a 14-play, 41-yard push – the Stars couldn't punch it into the end zone with first down on Eielson 4, settling for a 26 yard Joey Mahaffey field goal to cut Eielson's lead to 14-3 at the half.

"We didn't capitalize," said Mikah Boudreaux. Bob's oldest son and the states only 1,000 yard passer. "We get a touchdown instead of a field goal, and it's a new ball game."

But it didn't get any better for the 7-2 Stars. Eielson kept Soldotna's running game in check, holding Mahaffey and company to just 40 yards, and intercepted Boudreaux three times in the second half.

The Stars made it interesting late in the game when Boudreaux and Kellum combined for their 10th touchdown of the season, a 26-yarder with 5:54 left to cut Eielson's lead to 22-9. "Oh man," said Nystrom, "We had some blown coverage."

Soldotna junior Mike Foster recovered the onside kick, but Hill intercepted Boudreaux on fourth down and the Ravens promptly marched 83 yards on nine plays – including a 40-yard bomb from Leonard to Hill – to wrap up the victory with Brown's second score of the game.

When the final whistle blew, Eielson ran onto the field, and minutes later, Nystrom – who has won 89 games in his 18-year Alaska coaching career – sat on his players' shoulders, proudly holding the much-deserved state championship plaque.

"Makes you wonder why you are so blessed," said Nystrom.
